
United Payette

Valley County Land Exchange Public Opinion Survey Results October, 2025

Who We Are

United Payette was formed in the summer of 2021 to lead and represent the community in addressing issues related to the Idaho endowment lands in Valley County and to collaborate with city, county, and state officials.

How we arrived where we are

- 2020 Trident Holdings, LLC proposes 28K acre land exchange
- Early 2021 Local and state organizations/individuals form United Payette
- March 2021 IDL develops the Payette Endowment Lands Strategy (PELS)
- UP creates community-based plan to satisfy PELS: Cougar Island conservation easement, recreation leases on both east and west sides, trail easement)
- August 10, 2021 IDL rejects Trident proposal
- UP continues talks with IDL, USFS, IDPR, Valley County Commissioners, City of McCall
- 2024 USFS and IDL initiate land exchange discussions (no formal proposal yet)
- 2024 to present UP collaborates with U of I to design and implement public survey


Why a public survey?

- Public understanding of IDL and USFS missions
- Public perception of endowment land benefits
- Public perception of endowment land threats
- To learn what Valley County residents value when it comes to the area's endowment lands

Survey Basics

- UP engaged U of I to conduct survey during Summer, 2025. Survey paid for by generous donations to UP
- Invitations to participate sent to 6,738 addresses in Valley County
 - Needed 372 responses for a 5% margin of error with 95% confidence
- Received 840 complete surveys!
 - o Provides a 3.3% margin of error with 95% confidence
- 97% of respondents identify as year-long, primary residents

To what extent would you oppose or support a land exchange that transfers ownership of state endowment lands around Payette Lake and Little Payette Lake from the Idaho Department of Lands (IDL) to the US Forest Service (USFS)? In exchange for these state endowment lands (which USFS would own and manage), IDL will receive ownership of timber lands elsewhere in Idaho from the USFS.








Familiarity with the Difference Between Public Lands and Endowment Lands

Poll by Conservation Voters for Idaho conducted in July: When asked whether public lands in Idaho should remain public, or be made available for purchase and private ownership, 96% of registered voters in Idaho say public lands should remain in public hands.


The consensus transcends partisanship, with 97% of registered Democrats, 95% of registered Republicans, and 99% of voters registered without part preference agree.











What do the Threats results mean?

- 83% of survey
 respondents believe
 decreased water
 quality is a
 considerable threat
- 87% believe loss of wildlife habitat poses a significant threat
- 90% believe decreased ecosystem and watershed health represent significant threats
- Categories
 associated with
 economic values
 are generally not
 considered a threat,
 or only slightly a
 threat



What do the Threats results mean? (Percentages reflect extreme threat + very much a threat)


- 83% responded loss of fish habitat is a significant threat
- 88% responded loss of natural places is a significant threat

- 84% view loss of public access as a serious to extreme threat
- 75% responded loss of rural character is a significant threat

 65% responded loss of viewshed and/or scenic value represents a significant threat
