We plan to restore the property to open up to the public for camping and events, using all structures that are already in place. To Whom it may concern:

To begin I will introduce ourselves briefly. We are family first. Our company is made up of two hard working normal families. Two families with a common vision for creating a place not only for our families but for yours also. Eli and Kayla McClure, Kenny and Danielle Crawford all moved to Cascade recently from Emmett Idaho. The McClure's have 4 children ranging from infant to middle school age, and the Crawford's have 2 girls preschool age.

We are lovingly calling our proposed business Hidden Pines Guest Ranch. We have spoken to many Valley County locals and no one really knows about this hidden gem back on 130 Alpha Lane. We hope to change this and create a place that becomes a central gathering place for people from all over. With our family's combined years of experience in construction, ranch management, and events we plan to pour each and every one of our gifts into this land and project.

We believe that bringing people together is a gift, and even more so when you can do it in the serenity of nature. After the events of that last year we are more thankful than ever to be able to pursue our dream on this property. Both McClure's and Crawford's will reside on The property year round in 2 of the larger finished cabins, (cabins 18 & 19 see attached). We will be managing the day to day business as well as property management and maintenance. We chose these buildings because they were set to the left of the property on their own. This will give us the opportunity to put in a privacy fence around our personal residences and reroute camp traffic around and away from this small section of the property. We also have a camp host site in mind, at the front of the property and will have a host in place permanently. This will ensure we have an extra hand when we need it or when we need to leave the property for business or personal appointments.

The big idea is to offer the existing 20 cabins, 15 rv spots, and overnight horse and trailer accommodations, through out the year. As well as offering entire ranch rental for events such as weddings, summer camps, and retreats. Our primary busy season will be the 6 warmer months of the year. Although we have a plan in place to stay at least half capacity open through winter starting the second year of business. Of course this will mean insulating at least half the cabins and adding a heat source. Using all the structures already in place we plan to clear and clean up the landscape, and roads as well as add some finish work and furnishings to rental cabins. Also adding a corrals and fencing areas for over night horse accommodations. As we ad patio areas and daily walk ways we will add lighting to corral area, outside the bathroom facility and along any path ways as needed for safety.

There is plenty of parking in the baseball field area as well as volleyball court all below cabin 21 which we will utilize as the front check in office as it sits right at the road where vehicles will be coming in and out of. Ideally, we will have steady occupancy coming and going for cabin stays and rv stays. We also plan on having 6-10 weddings on the calendar seasonally, utilizing the commercial kitchen and dining hall as well as the event hall for these specifically. We would also like to reserve some time in our scheduled reservations for 4-6 non-profit, educational or religious camps.

After speaking with the fire department, we have confirmed that there is too much ground cover and brush especially around the buildings, and potentially a tree or two that need removed, and the kitchen needs a few upgrades we intend to address immediately. As well as having emergency exit

signage, and an emergency plan for evacuation as needed to ensure safety of our guests. We plan to make necessary adjustments to at least 2 cabins to be handicap and wheelch air accessible.

We have a call into the road department to inquire about dust abatement and will comply with their suggestions as well. We also plan to contact Elt Haserbeck about using the historical sign holder on the corner of the hwy and Alpha lane directly across from Alpha nursery, previously used by Camp Cascade.

We will have policies in line to ensure all animals are on a leash and contained, and no unsupervised children will be left unattended to contribute to our peaceful and safe environment we will be creating.

We are really looking forward to becoming a part of the community in a positive way. Bringing new creative solutions, events, and moral to this abandoned exclusive property. Opening it up for many families to enjoy. We are aware of a demographic of families who aren't being served with recreation accommodations in their prices range. We are not out to make a million dollars but we are for creating an affordable and welcoming place for families to enjoy right here in Valley county. We believe our concepts, connections and work ethic will make this a seamless transition from exclusive church camp to a modern gathering place for people of all walks of life. We hope to devote a few rv spots to traveling workers and long term stays, to bring talent and labor to the valley while offering a family environment to those away from home. Both Eli and Kenneth work for Granite construction locally in Cascade and have access to any equipment and skill sets needed to make these projects timely and efficient.

1. 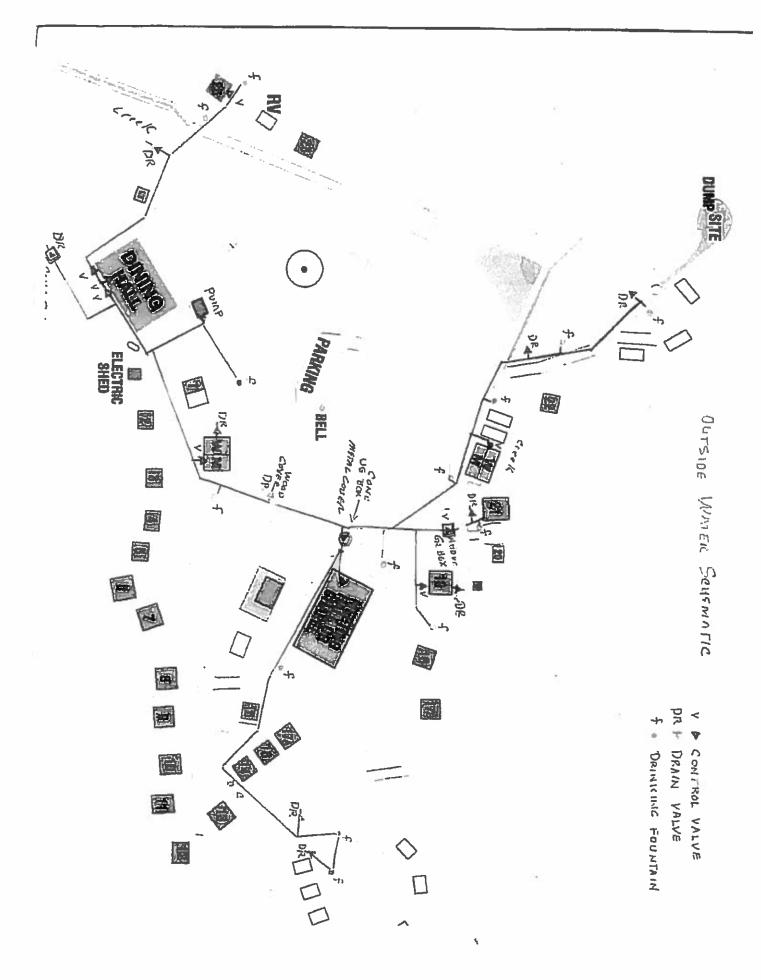

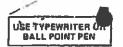

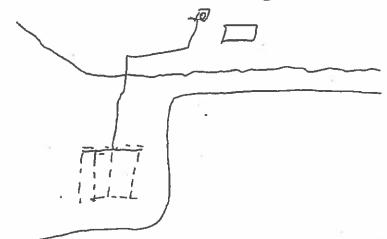
