Commissioner Thompson seconded the motion. No further discussion, all in favor. This motion is made with the understanding that building sites are accessed from shared driveways built to fire department standards, that are described in the deeds, and maintenance is provided for in the Protective Covenants, Conditions, Restrictions; and, Valley County has no responsibility thereto. Mr. Eiguren discussed some changes that he was willing to make to his legislation that wouldn't give the legislators control of Valley Counties Lake. Commissioner Maupin made a motion to support water quality of Payette council as amended. Commissioner Thompson seconded the motion. No further discussion, all in favor. Motion passed to support water quality of Payette council as amended.
