Valley County Waterways Advisory Committee Meeting

Minutes for August 5, 2025

Present: Committee Chairman Jally Zeydel, Jared Montague, Steven Hull (Fire Chief), Phillip Moore, Kevin Copperi (VC Sheriff), Kevin Turner, (VCSO) Jordan Messner, Matt Linde, Dave Bingaman, Forrest Atkinson (Manager, City of McCall - in place of Kurt Wolfe, who is on vacation), Jason Dobis (BOR), Phoebe Wallace (Recreational Boating Program Manager – IDPR)

The meeting was called to order by Jally Zeydel at 9:00am. Explained function of the committee to those in attendance.

Jared Montague made a motion to approve the minutes from July 8, 2025. Steve Hull seconded the motion, and the motion was approved unanimously.

#### Jordan Messner - Idaho Fish & Game

- No motors allowed above the Fishing Bridge (North Fork Payette)) at this time this
  discussion revolves around the possibility of moving that line north to be on a direct
  parallel of the S-bridge. The purpose would be to allow for fisherman to use their
  boats to go bass fishing during a relatively small window in the spring. Electric
  trolling motors only; 2.5 mph limit is the proposal.
- Jordan can come up with a specific proposal so that we can see details
- Jally will contact the BOR (Bureau of Reclamation)

# Dave Bingaman - Valley County Director of Parks and Recreation

- Dave's department has been tasked by VC commissioners to discuss ordinance 20-11, which is 5 years old and needs review.
- Western Whitewater Power Boat Association would like to see more opportunities for recreation on the North Fork specifically, Smylie Bridge to Lardo Bridge.
- The idea is to "crack" the ordinance open and take public input on how the ordinance affects all the tributaries.
- Complaints by users and property owners along the lake the ordinance needs to be revisited noise is the largest complaint from the high-powered boats.
- Ideas to pursue: full closure; non-motorized days v motorized days, alternate days
  - o VC Commissioners are generally not interested in any additional use
- Are the existing laws being followed? Enforcement by VCSO?
- County would probably have a public hearing some time in the fall of 2025 (October or November)

- Essentially, opening up County Water Ordinance (20-11) and determining what changes, if any, need to be made. This would include discussion regarding no-wake zones, etc.
- Waterways management is up for review, as well.
- A question was asked regarding "River Gaps" (keeping livestock in the appropriate area) and how that would work with water users.
- Some in attendance asked general questions public input will come later.
- Noise on the water was discussed (88 decibels at idle is the threshold state code)
- Environmental Impact Statement not required for changing this ordinance

### **Matt Linde**

- Lost a dock chain a the end of the Peninsula Campground Loop. Will replace that before the weekend
- Would like to remove some abandoned docks
  - Kevin Turner offered his help from the VCSO
  - o Jordan Messner offered his help, as well.

# Forrest Atkinson - Manager, City of McCall (in place of Kurt Wolfe)

• Would advocate for the 500ft no wake zone

#### Jordan Messner

- Dock at Horsethief Osprey Bay
  - Dock needs to be replaced mostly used by fisherman and some motor boats. No overnight mooring at this dock.
  - o Some campgrounds would be complimented by overnight mooring docks.

## **Kevin Turner**

- 153 on-the-water inspections last week on Payette Lake by two deputies.
- Boats are running well; new boat has been through first maintenance period
- Custom Weld boat (with new motor) is running well.
- 5 deputies working right now pull some out of the jail for patrol during busy times
- Marine Tactical Class (Cascade & McCall) held September 9-11, 2025

## Jason Dobis - Bureau of Reclamation

- Started study to model the lake to see if operations (release water, etc.) affect the water quality of the lake. No significant changes in water quality. Study is available.
- EA for the marina project is moving forward
