## C. WORK SESSION:

1. Valley County Comprehensive Plan Review: The P&Z Commission is reviewing updates to the Valley County Comprehensive Plan. The public is welcome to attend and listen; however, this is not a public hearing. A public hearing will be scheduled at a future date.

Commissioners and staff continued the discussion on edits to the Valley County Comprehensive Plans. Updates have been made to tables, graphs, and data. Future Land Use Maps drafts were reviewed and changes requested. Ordinances are based on the Comprehensive Plan.

Commissioners and Staff discussed impacts on water quality and quantity, well monitoring, nitrates, phosphorus, and cyanide. Idaho Department of Environmental Quality has not designated any high nitrate areas in Valley County; this is reevaluated every two years.

Commissioners and Staff discussed development agreements, impact fees, proportional share of costs, fire districts, deed restrictions, short-term rentals, multi-family housing, road improvement and maintenance, and wildland urban interface requirements. Impact fees can be only for capital improvements. Development agreements can include requirements for school bus stops. Affordable housing is an issue nationwide, but emphasized in Valley County due to the 78% rate of second home ownership.

Commissioners and Staff discussed adding a goal to encourage agriculture remains a viable element in Valley County's economy. Commissioners made additional edits to the draft plan.

Possible ordinance changes include requirements for riparian areas, increased setbacks from high water lines, and requirements for building in the wildland urban interface area.
