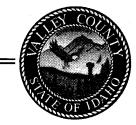
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IN THE OFFICE OF THE VALLEY COUNTY BOARD OF COMMISSIONERS CASCADE, IDAHO September 20, 2021

Acting Chairman, Dave Bingaman led the Pledge of Allegiance.

Acting Chairman, Dave Bingaman presented the commissioners' agenda for September 20, 2021. Acting Chairman, Dave Bingaman would like to add a matter to the agenda regarding the condition of the Solid Waste Transfer Site. Commissioner Maupin requested to add a matter to the agenda regarding the defacing of the signs at St. Luke's Hospital. Commissioner Maupin made a motion to approve the agenda as amended. Acting Chairman Bingaman seconded the motion. No further discussion, all in favor. Motion passed to approve the amended agenda for September 20, 2021.

Acting Chairman, Bingaman presented the commissioner meeting minutes of September 13, 2021. Commissioner Maupin advised of the changes that she requested and Clerk, Douglas Miller provided the wording for the changes that were made. Commissioner Maupin made a motion to approve the commissioner meeting minutes of September 13, 2021. Acting Chairman Bingaman seconded the motion. No further discussion, all in favor. Motion passed to approve the commissioner meeting minutes of September 13, 2021.

Board of County Commissioners Meeting September 20, 2021 Page 1 Acting Chairman Bingaman began the discussion related to the appointment of Mr. Scott Turlington to the Valley County Waterways Committee. Acting Chairman Bingaman made a motion to appoint Mr. Scott Turlington to the Valley County Waterways Committee. Commissioner Maupin seconded the motion. No further discussion, all in favor. Motion passed to appoint Mr. Scott Turlington to the Valley County Waterways Committee.

Acting Chairman Bingaman discussed the condition of the Solid Waste Transfer Site. He advised that the not only was the Solid Waste Transfer Site a safety hazard, but the woody debris pile was not being maintained. He discussed that the condition of the area was unacceptable, and he had significant concerns. He advised that the Lake Shore Disposal Regional Manager would be making a site visit and he explained that he would be attending the site visit with the regional manager. He would like to come up with a mandate for separation of the material. He continued to describe the condition and the concerns that he had with the lack of upkeep being done by Lake Shore Disposal. He believed that other options need to be explored and felt that there needed to be a solution presented by Lake Shore Disposal. The matter was put on the agenda for October 4, 2021, for further discussion.

Grant Writer, Mary Rosen presented on the acceptance of McCall Lot Funding for Snow Removal of \$11,000. Commissioner Maupin made a motion to accept the McCall Lot Funding for \$11,000 for snow removal. Acting Chairman Bingaman seconded the motion. No further discussion, all in favor. Motion passed to accept the McCall Lot Funding of \$11,000 for snow removal.

Acting Chairman Bingaman began the bid opening for janitorial services at the Valley County Courthouse and McCall Annex. Acting Chairman Bingaman opened the first bid from Pro-Power Clean for the Valley County Courthouse with a bid for Schedule #1 for \$9,768 per month and \$117,216 annually. Schedule #2 Bid was with cleaning supplies for \$10,393.00 per month and \$124,716 annually. The second bid opening was from KBS Schedule #1 bid for \$7,350 per month or \$88,200 annually. The Schedule #2 bid was for \$7,750 per month or \$93,000 annually. Commissioner Maupin made a motion to approve the Schedule II Bid from KBS for \$7,750 per month and \$93,000 annually for cleaning of the Valley County Courthouse. Acting Chairman Bingaman seconded the motion. No further discussion, all in favor. Motion passed to accept the Schedule #2 bid from KBS for \$7,750 per month and \$93,000 annually for cleaning of the Valley County Courthouse.

Acting Chairman Bingaman opened the bids from McCall Annex and the first bid that was opened was from KBS for Bid Schedule #1 for \$2,235 per month and \$26,820 annually. Bid Schedule #2 from KBS was for \$2,410 per month and \$28,920 annually. Acting Chairman Bingaman opened the Schedule #1 Bid from Pro Power Clean for the McCall Annex for \$1,825.00 per month and \$21,900. Scheduled #2 Bid from Pro Power Clean was \$1,9850 per month and \$23,820 annually. Acting Chairman Bingaman opened the final bid from Bonded LLC with a bid of \$2,000 per month for Schedule #1 and Schedule #2 was for \$2,150 per month. Commissioner Maupin made a motion to approve the Schedule #2 Bid received from Bonded LLC for continued cleaning at the McCall Annex at \$2,150 per month and \$25,800 annually. Acting Chairman Bingaman seconded the motion. No further discussion, all in favor. Motion passed to accept the Schedule #2 Bid from Bonded LLC for cleaning of the McCall Annex for \$2,150 per month and \$25,800 annually.

Acting Chairman Bingaman began the bid openings for propane services. The first bid opened was from Ed Staub & Sons with a bid of \$.083 over Belvieu RAC price. The second bid opened was from AmeriGas at \$.032 over Belvieu RAC price. The third bid received was from Valley Wide Cooperative was for \$.0519 over Belvieu RAC price. Commissioner Maupin made a motion to approve the bid received from AmeriGas at \$.032 over the Belvieu RAC price. Acting Chairman Bingaman seconded the motion. No further discussion, all in favor. Motion passed to accept the bid from AmeriGas at \$.032 per gallon above Belvieue RAC price.

Acting Chairman Bingaman began the fuel bid openings for Valley County. He advised that there was one bid that was received from Diamond Fuel & Feed. Acting Chairman Bingaman made a motion to accept the fuel bid received from Diamond Fuel & Feed. Commissioner Maupin seconded the motion. No further discussion, all in favor. Motion passed to accept the fuel bid received from Diamond Fuel & Feed.

Human Resource Director, Pat Duncan presented a service award for Road Director, Jeff McFadden for twenty years of service with Valley County.

The commissioners had the opportunity to ask questions to Cynda and she responded accordingly.

Acting Chairman Bingaman asked to hear a presentation from the applicant. The applicant was not in attendance.

Stephanie Nelson with Wildland Fire Prevention & Associates presented the bids for West Hazard Unit Bid. Acting Chairman Bingaman opened the first bid was Barron Loper for \$8,400. Acting Chairman Bingaman opened the second bid received from Specialized Land Works for \$8,400. With both bids being the same the commissioners asked questions to Stephane Nelson. Commissioner Maupin made a motion to accept the bid from Specialized Land Works for \$8,400. Acting Chairman Bingaman seconded the motion. No further discussion, all in favor. Motion passed to accept the bid from Specialized Land Works for \$8,400.

She explained the existing fire mitigation projects that were taking place and suggested allowing additional acreage. Acting Chairman Bingaman made a motion to allow the additional acreage as presented for Unit 13 and Unit 14. Commissioner Maupin seconded the motion. No further discussion, all in favor. Motion passed to allow the additional acreage as presented by Stephanie Nelson for Bear Basin Unit 13 and Unit 14.

Acting Chairman Bingaman began the Oath of Office for newly appointed Treasurer, Johanna Defoort.

Chief Deputy Treasurer, Jody Green presented the request to authorize Treasurer, Johanna Defoort access to Idaho First Bank Account, MBS Account and LGIP Account. Commissioner Maupin made a motion to approve adding Treasurer, Johanna Defoort to the Idaho First Bank Account, MBS Account and LGIP Account. Acting Chairman Bingaman seconded the motion. No further discussion, all in favor. Motion passed to authorize Treasurer, Johanna Defoort access to Idaho First Bank Account, MBS Account and LGIP Account.

The commissioners recessed at 11:48 a.m.

The commissioners returned at 1:00 p.m.

Acting Chairman Bingaman asked to hear from proponents. The record will reflect that there was no one present as a proponent.

Acting Chairman Bingaman asked to hear from uncommitted. The record will reflect that there was no one present as uncommitted.

Acting Chairman Bingaman asked to hear from opponents. The record will reflect that there was no one present as an opponent.

Acting Chairman Bingaman closed the Public Hearing at 1:09 p.m. and brought the matter back to the commissioners for deliberation. Acting Chairman Bingaman seconded the motion. No further discussion, all in favor. Motion passed to approve Ordinance #21-10 Parks and Recreation Chapter 2 Campgrounds, Chapter 3 Raft Launch area, and Chapter 4 Parking Areas and approve Resolution #21-17 Fees as amended.

Valley County Public Defender, Scott Erekson presented the Fiscal Year 2022 Public Defender Contract. Commissioner Maupin asked about the expenditures for conflict public defenders and Mr. Erekson responded to the question. Acting Chairman Bingaman made a motion to approve the Fiscal Year 2022 Public Defender Contract. Commissioner Maupin seconded the motion. No further discussion, all in favor. Motion passed to approve the Fiscal Year 2022 Public Defender Contract.

Mr. Erekson provided a brief quarterly to the commissioners and explained the yearly reporting requirements to the Public Defense Commission.

Road Director, Jeff McFadden presented on an opportunity to receive a donation from Horizons' Lifestyle and Education Team of radar signs to be erected on Warm Lake Highway and other locations within the city limits of Cascade. Jeff explained that Perpetua Resources awarded a grant of \$10,000 to Horizons' Lifestyle and Education Team for the six radar signs. Commissioner Maupin made a motion to approve the donation of six radar signs from Horizons' Lifestyle and Education Team. Acting Chairman Bingaman seconded the motion. No further discussion, all in favor. Motion passed.

University of Idaho Extension Educator, Melissa Hamilton presented on the University of Idaho Standard Extension Agreement and the options for Valley County to consider regarding operations and the current arrangements with Melissa being the supervisor of the extension employees. Human Resource Director, Pat Duncan also provided her input regarding the current arrangements with University of Idaho Extension Educator being the supervisor of the existing employees. Melissa informed the commissioners how she was determining what programs should be offered by the University of Idaho Standard Extension Agreement.

Acting Chairman Bingaman made a motion to approve the University of Idaho Extension Office Agreement with Kelly's Whitewater Park. Commissioner Maupin seconded the motion. No further discussion, all in favor. Motion passed to approve the University of Idaho Extension Office Agreement with Kelly's Whitewater Park.

Sheriff, Patti Bolen presented the On-Solve (Code Red) renewal agreement. Commissioner Maupin made a motion to approve the On-Solve (Code Red) renewal agreement. Acting Chairman Bingaman seconded the motion. No further discussion, all in favor. Motion passed to approve the On-Solve (Code Red) renewal agreement.

Sheriff Bolen presented the Idaho Policing Policy renewal agreement. Commissioner Maupin made amotion to approve the Idaho Policing Policy renewal agreement. Acting Chairman Bingaman seconded the motion. No further discussion, all in favor. Motion passed to approve the Idaho Policing Policy renewal agreement.

Sheriff Bolen presented the Century Link/Lumen work order authorization to begin the transfer of the equipment from the existing location to the Emergency Operation Center. Chief Deputy Prosecuting Attorney, Brian Oakey provided his input to the commissioners regarding the service agreement that was submitted to him for review. He felt that the work order could be signed but did not feel that the commissioners should approve the service agreement. Commissioner Maupin made a motion to approve the Century Link/Lumen work order. Acting Chairman Bingaman seconded the motion. No further discussion, all in favor. Motion passed to approve the Century Link/Lumen work order.

Sheriff Bolen presented the Joint Powers agreement between Valley County and City of Cascade for Law Enforcement Services. She advised that Chief Deputy Prosecuting Attorney, Brian Oakey had the opportunity to review the agreement and explained that the Prosecuting Attorney's Office would now be prosecuting misdemeanor cases for the City of Cascade. The commissioners had the opportunity to ask questions to Sheriff Bolen and she responded accordingly. Commissioner Maupin made a motion to approve the Joint Powers agreement between Valley County and City of Cascade for Law Enforcement Services. Acting Chairman Bingaman seconded the motion. No further discussion, all in favor. Motion passed to approve the Joint Powers Agreement between Valley County and City of Cascade for Law Enforcement Services.

Pat Duncan started the conversation with the commissioners about COVID Protocols at Valley County Courthouse. Commissioner Maupin discussed the State being at crisis care state. Plastic shields up, back to hand sanitizers, maintain 6 feet distance. Monica Miller from Donnelly talked about her experience listening to Dr. Cole. The employees of the county discussed what they want the commissioners to do. Commissioner Maupin explained that she wants everyone to make good personal discussion but she wont support a mask mandate. Acting Chairman Bingaman agreed with Commissioner Maupin's comments.

The commissioners adjourned the meeting at 5:05 p.m.
