## Approval of Minutes

### IT Director Report

Connie McCullick, IT Director, presented the Public Property committee members with the IT invoices for review and approval.

Motion by Munson; second by Russell to approve payment of the invoices presented today. The motion carried unanimously.

The 2026 IT Department Budget was presented for review. McCullick is requesting \$50,000 for capital items. Last year, these expenses were part of the Capital Projects borrowing, but this year, she was advised to use the Technology Account instead. Accordingly, \$50,000 from the Technology Account will be earmarked for this expense in 2026.

The new phone system project is moving forward. McCullick will be connecting with the project manager from Marco. The replacement server equipment is expected to arrive by the end of September. All computers must be updated to Windows 11 by mid-October.

Connie will be out on medical leave for hand surgery beginning November 6<sup>th</sup> for three weeks.

Bldg Maint Update

ServPro is continuing with the remodel from the water damage.

The Clerk will ask the adjuster if the damaged furniture needs to be saved

for any reason, or if they can scrap it all.

The 2026 Maintenance Department Budget was reviewed by the committee

today. The budget decreased by about \$7,600 from last year.
