PROWERS COUNTY FAIRGROUNDS FACILITY RENTAL RESERVATION AGREEMENT

Between Prowers County Board of Commissioners (Commissioners) and the Authorizing Agent (User) renting the facility, including any parking areas, if applicable (Rented Premises).

- Determination of fees for use of the facilities shall be made by the Commissioners in accordance with the
 established fee schedule and agreed to by the User at the time the reservation is confirmed. Use of the Rented
 Premises shall not include Prowers County personnel, including, but not limited to, County Maintenance
 Personnel.
- 2. Unique events may require an increase in fees/charges and/or conditions in addition to those shown. The Commissioners reserve the right to modify any of the conditions as necessary on a case-by-case basis. Holiday use of the Fairgrounds is subject to approval by the Commissioners. All County holidays are observed by County Maintenance Personnel. No Prowers County Personnel will be made available to the User over County-approved Thanksgiving and Christmas holidays. Additional fees will be assessed for events scheduled on holidays. Overtime charges for County Maintenance Personnel at a rate of two times the normal hourly rate will be charged for holiday events, in addition to regular fees and charges, with the exceptions described previously in this paragraph.
- Use of all facilities shall be scheduled through the Prowers County Administration Office only.
 Fees and deposits:
 - a) A non-refundable booking fee of \$25.00 per event must be paid when each event is scheduled.
 - b) The \$25.00 booking fee is due before an individual or entity may have their name placed on the Fairgrounds calendar to reserve a facility at the Fairgrounds.
 - c) If the event does not go forward for whatever reason, the \$25.00 fee WILL NOT BE REFUNDED.
 - d) The remainder of the Rental Fee and Damage/Cleaning Deposit must be submitted to the office no less than ten (10) working days prior to the date scheduled. (Commercial users: fees must be paid in certified funds.) The Damage/Cleaning Deposit is required and due from all Users whether use fees are waived or not. Failure to pay fees ten (10) working days prior to the event may result in cancellation of facility use. Access to the facilities at any time other than stated on this form is not allowed unless prior approval is received from the Commissioners. Please note that the Damage/Cleaning Deposit refund, if any, due back to the User will be provided by a Prowers County check. Checks are issued upon approval at the Commissioners' meetings.
- 4. The scheduling of the activities shall be made in the name of one individual who must, as a condition of use, read this document and accept responsibility for adequately supervising the event; assure that the facilities are used for the purpose for which they are scheduled; reimburse the County for damage to the property or facilities including excessive clean-up costs that may occur in connection with the event; assure payment, in full, of all charges for space and equipment requested; and ensure that all promotion and advertising of events involving the use of the facilities shall identify the individual or group sponsor of the event.
- 5. The Damage/Cleaning Deposit must be paid within ten (10) days prior to the scheduled event. The Damage/Cleaning Deposit shall be utilized by Prowers County, if necessary, for cleanup and repair of damages of the Rented Premises. In the event that the User performs cleanup of the Rented Premises in a suitable manner and there is no damage, The Damage/Cleaning Deposit will be reviewed for return to the User at the next regularly scheduled meeting of the Commissioners. The Rented Premises is an alcohol-free facility. If any alcohol is brought to the Fairgrounds, the entire deposit will be retained. The User will be personally liable for any expense for damage and/or cleanup in excess of the required deposit.
- 6. In case of cancellation, the Rental Fee will be refunded (less the booking fee) if notice of cancellation is received ten (10) working days prior to scheduled use. If the event is canceled due to inclement weather, the event may

be rescheduled with no additional fees due. If the event is rescheduled for any other reason without the required notice, an additional booking fee will be charged.

- 7. Subleasing or charging additional fees to use the Rented Premises will not be permitted.
- 8. Non-commercial Users may have one (1) day in advance for set-up, decorating, etc. between the hours of 8:00 am and 4:00 pm, provided that there is nothing previously booked on that date. If additional days are required for set-up, an additional fee of \$100 will be charged for each additional day. Commercial Users: If special set-up/tear-down is required, standard facility use days will be charged on a ½ day basis.
- 9. Liability insurance is required for all commercial events. Certain "at risk" activities, i.e. rodeos, tractor pulls, carnivals, circuses, etc. are required to provide liability insurance. An insurance certificate showing Prowers County as an additional insured must be provided to the County no later than ten (10) business days prior to the scheduled event.
- 10. Under Colorado Law, an equine professional is not liable for any injury to or the death of a participant in equine activities resulting in the inherent risks of equine activities, pursuant to Section 13-21-119, Colorado Revised Statutes.
- 11. The User acknowledges that the User's rental of Prowers County's property is not subject to the direct supervision and control of Prowers County personnel. Accordingly, and in express consideration for the within Agreement, User hereby agrees to indemnify, and hold harmless, Prowers County, its officers, agents, and employees from and against any and all claims for liability asserted for personal injury, or property damage to any and all persons or entities whatsoever, and arising out of the User's rental of Prowers County's property as hereinabove set forth. This indemnification expressly extends to any and all damage awards, and shall further cover all costs of defense, which shall be conducted in Prowers County's sole discretion, including attorney's and expert witness fees.
- 12. The Agreement shall be and become binding upon, and inure to the benefit of the parties hereto, their heirs, personal representatives, successors and designs. Any action necessary to construe, interpret, or enforce the provision of the Agreement shall be brought and maintained in the District Court in and for Prowers County, Colorado, with the substantially prevailing party therein being entitled, as a matter of contract law an agreement to recover its costs and expenses therein incurred, including reasonable attorneys' and expert witness fees.
- 13. Falsified or misleading information on this form may be cause for cancellation of this Agreement and forfeiture of the Damage/Cleaning Deposit and/or Rental Fees paid and may result in loss of future usage of the Rented Premises.
- 14. The User shall be required to call for an on-site facility orientation with the Fairgrounds caretaker no later than five (5) working days prior to the event. The User will be familiarized with information pertaining to use of the facility, obtain keys, and will have the opportunity to ask questions of the Fairgrounds caretaker. The Fairgrounds Caretaker can be reached by calling 719-931-0034 and is available to schedule an orientation Monday Friday 9:00 am to Noon and 1:00pm to 3:00pm. Regularly scheduled monthly meeting organizers are not required to complete an orientation, however, are expected to cooperate with the expectations for use outlined in this Agreement. The User understands that Prowers County does not employ 7 day per week, 24 hour per day Fairgrounds Personnel. The Fairgrounds Caretaker hours are scheduled from 8:00 am to 5:00 pm, Monday –Friday. The Fairgrounds Caretaker schedule may change to correlate with an event; however, changes must be pre-approved and are at the discretion of the Prowers County Maintenance Supervisor.
- 15. Every effort has been made to provide that the Rented Premises is adequately maintained and appropriately prepared for normal use. It is further understood that the building and grounds systems can, and do, fail at times. Failures may include, but are not limited to: electrical outlet power losses and blown breakers due to abnormal use and overloaded circuits, public announcing or loudspeaker malfunctions, lighting failures, water supply problems, and restroom malfunctions, etc. There are no guarantees against such failures either implied or stipulated in this Agreement. Prowers County Personnel will only be made available during off-hours in the

event of an emergency pertaining to life safety or unsanitary conditions. All other unexpected occurrences should be documented and will be addressed on the next regular workday.

- 16. The User understands that costs incurred by Prowers County due to responding to non-emergency calls for service, facility or grounds clean-up, and sub-contractor repairs for damages to equipment or facilities will be billed to the user at a rate of 2 times the actual costs. It is the User's responsibility to minimize non-emergency calls for service.
- 17. The User agrees that it is their responsibility to provide, and be responsible for, the equipment or supplies necessary to circumvent potential failures in the buildings, restrooms, or arena including, but not limited to: portable generators, portable toilets, portable amplifier or loudspeaker systems, water, and/or water trucks for wetting a dusty arena floor, toilet paper and hand towel paper supplies, first aid supplies, etc.
- 18. The User is specifically responsible to ensure adherence to these written and any posted policies and to:
 - a) Provide written documentation specifying any concerns, system failures, or break-downs and deliver that documentation to the Fairgrounds Caretaker. Please do not manipulate circuit breakers.
 - b) Pick-up trash and debris accumulated during the event including parking areas and deposit the trash in the 55-gallon trash drums provided, or if full, into available dumpsters.
 - c) Re-stock indoor and outdoor men's and women's restrooms with toilet paper and paper hand towels as needed throughout the event. The Fairgrounds Caretaker will make these items available to users.
 - d) Pick-up trash in, and around, the indoor and outdoor restrooms, the kitchen, and concession stands and leave fixtures, appliances, and counter surfaces clean. Sweep and mop, or vacuum indoor floor surfaces.
 - e) Make appropriate arrangements for providing the necessary crowd control, public safety, and building security for the event.
 - f) Ensure that scheduled dance events end at 12:00 Midnight; no exceptions.
 - g) Provide event security and present evidence of said security upon request by the Commissioners.
- 19. Prowers County assumes no responsibility for lost or stolen items.
- 20. Alcohol is not allowed on the Fairgrounds at any time. The county has a zero-tolerance policy regarding alcohol. Any violation of this policy will result in immediate revocation of access to the Fairgrounds, a permanent ban going forward, and County retention of the entire damage deposit. Local law enforcement has been authorized to remove parties in violation of this policy.

A commercial event is defined as an activity where fees are charged to entrants and the sponsoring entity retains some or all of the proceeds from the activity or where goods or services are offered for sale or lease to the general public. The Commissioners reserve the right to determine if an event is a commercial activity.
- 4. Commercial vendors will pay a fee in addition to the fees listed on the attached fee schedule in the amount of 1% of gross sales, based upon the vendor's projections. The amount of the projected sales will be verified by comparison of the projection to Sales Tax as reported to the State.
- RV or Camper Parking is only allowed for a total of three (3) days per thirty (30)-day time period, unless in conjunction with a Registered Event.
 - a. RV or Camper Parking in conjunction with a Registered Event must follow the policies set forth in 8a, below.
 - b. For RV or Camper Parking NOT in conjunction with a Registered Event:
 - Electrical and water hook-up fees are to be paid and collected at the Prowers County Administration Office at 301 S Main Street, Suite 215, Lamar, CO 81052 or by calling (719) 336-8025 during normal business hours OR at the Fairgrounds Drop Box.
 - ii. Each individual RV hook-up is provided for use exclusively by only one reserved RV. There is no sharing of electrical or water hook-ups.
 - No horses or livestock shall be penned near or around RV hook-up areas. Paid RV users must pen horses in covered stalls.
 - No RV, Trailer, Camper or Horse Trailer electrical hook-ups are allowed at any electrical outlet located on the Pavilion Structure.
 - v. The individual or organization on record at the Prowers County Administration Office will be responsible to pay for any damage incurred due to unauthorized electrical or water connections.
- 6. It is the responsibility of the Event Organizer to make arrangements to meet on-site with the Fairgrounds Caretaker no later than four (4) days prior to the event to receive building keys and facility use instructions.
- REGISTERED EVENTS ONLY:
 - a. Covered and uncovered stall fees are to be reserved, collected, refunded for cleaning, and accounted for by the Event Organizer with the understanding that

if covered stalls are cleaned by the Event Organizer after use, the amount collected is split 50%/50% between the Event Organization and Prowers County.

- 8. REGISTERED EVENTS ONLY:
 - a. RV Electrical and water hook-up fees are to be reserved, collected, and accounted for by the Event Organizer with the understanding that:
 - i. Each individual RV hook-up is provided for use exclusively by only one reserved RV. There is no sharing of electrical or water hook-ups.
 - ii. No horses or livestock shall be penned near or around RV hook-up areas. Paid RV users must pen horses in covered stalls.
 - iii. No RV, Trailer, Camper or Horse Trailer electrical hook-ups are allowed at any electrical outlet located on the Pavilion Structure. The Event Organization will be responsible to pay for any damage incurred due to unauthorized electrical connections.

PROWERS COUNTY FAIRGROUNDS REGISTERED RODEO EVENTS

FAIRGROUNDS USE:

The Prowers County Fairgrounds is available for registered rodeo events in-season from April through October. Conditions for use of the facilities for all events including registered rodeo events are specifically detailed in the following information:

- 1. Prowers County Fairgrounds Facility Rental Reservation Agreement, 3 pages. Revised October 20, 2011.
- 2. Prowers County Fairgrounds Facility Rental Agreement, 1 page. Revised October 20, 2011.
- 3. Fairgrounds Fee Schedule, 2 pages. Revised October 18, 2011.
- 4. All event organizers who may be interested in reserving the Prowers County Fairgrounds for a registered rodeo event are encouraged to read very carefully all of the rental information provided by Prowers County before scheduling any rodeo event.

REGISTERED RODEO EVENTS:

Scheduled registered rodeo events are to be conducted in cooperation with the established fees and agreements for use of the Prowers County Fairgrounds. Event organizers are encouraged to include this information in all event literature distributed to potential rodeo participants in an effort to lessen costly misunderstandings during the event.

Unless otherwise specified, the following are applicable to registered rodeo events:

- 1. The fairgrounds rodeo arena is watered regularly using a water reel. Use of the water reel by event organizers is prohibited. The rodeo arena may be watered once daily during a registered rodeo event at the event organizers request only if scheduled and coordinated with the Fairgrounds Caretaker.
- 2. The fairgrounds rodeo arena is worked prior to the rodeo event by the Fairgrounds Caretaker using Prowers County equipment. Working the arena during the event is the responsibility of the event coordinator. The county tractor and attached arena king finisher are available for use by the event coordinator, or specified driver, for the duration of the event. A key to the tractor is provided only after the specified driver has met on-site with the Fairgrounds Caretaker for operating instructions.
- 3. Concession stand use is by reservation only. Call the Prowers County Extension service (719-336-7734) to reserve
- 4. The event organizer is responsible to reserve and collect fees for covered stalls located in the Prowers County Pavilion. The stalls are located in the Prowers County Sale Barn and set-up by Prowers County Staff before the event.
- 5. The event organizer is responsible for ensuring the following:
 - a. Scheduling with the Fairgrounds Caretaker for setting up horse stalls in the Pavilion.
 - b. Scheduling with the Fairgrounds Caretaker for cleaning the stalls after the event.
- 6. The event organizer is responsible for reserving and collecting all fees associated with R.V. hook-ups, dry camping, and horse stall fees.

The event organizer is responsible for ensuring the following:

- 1. <u>No</u> horses shall be tied or penned at, or near, any R.V. electrical or water hook-up located at the arena parking area and arena parking area fencing, or at the R.V. hook-ups located north of the Prowers County Pavilion.
- 2. No R.V. campers, horse trailers, or other similar vehicles shall not be allowed to park near, and/or plug any electrical cord into the electrical outlets located in the Prowers County Pavilion.
- 3. <u>No horses shall be tied to, or penned near, any permanent fence or any tree located anywhere on Prowers County Fairgrounds property.</u>

- 4. <u>All</u> dry camping and horse penning shall be located in the southwest dirt parking area only. Under no circumstances shall dry camping and penning be located on roto-mill, asphalt, or grass areas elsewhere on the Prowers County Fairgrounds property. The Event Organizer is responsible for the cost of clean-up if horses are penned or tied in areas outside dry camp areas.
- 5. <u>All</u> R.V. hook-ups (pedestal) provided for use during registered rodeo events are for one (1) R.V. camper only. Under no circumstances shall more than one R.V. camper plug into a reserved pedestal.
- 6. <u>All</u> horses and livestock are prohibited from access to paved pedestrian and driveways, grassy areas, treed areas, and covered buildings with the exception of the Prowers County Pavilion.

USE OF THE PROWERS COUNTY FAIRGROUNDS R.V. ELECTRIC PEDESTALS

In an on-going effort to mitigate potential damage, and to maintain safe, reliable electrical pedestals it is the responsibility of the Event Organizer to remind each camper utilizing the pedestals that:

- Each electrical pedestal is wired for 50 amp., 30 amp., or 20 amp. uses and should not be overloaded with multiple or piggyback cords and appliances.
- Each electrical pedestal is intended to be used by a single user. One camper one pedestal. Choose one 50, 30, or 20-amp outlet that best meets the required load for each R.V. or Camp Trailer.
- Each electrical pedestal is complete and ready for use. Under no circumstances shall the face plate cover be removed and/or the electrical outlets, wiring, or related pedestal components be manipulated.
- Use only safe and well-maintained electrical cords and plugs designed to carry the specified load. Under no circumstances shall exposed cord wires be direct wired into any electrical pedestal or pedestal outlet.
- Do not secure livestock or pets to the electrical pedestals or water hydrants located in designated R.V. campsites or throughout the fairgrounds.
- The electrical pedestal located north of the Crow's Nest is intended for auxiliary use only and is not available for campers.
- Report any damaged pedestals to the event coordinator, or fairgrounds staff as soon as the damage is discovered. Damage to pedestals will be charged to the event organizer at a rate double the cost for repair or replacement.
- Under no circumstances shall RV Pedestals be used by vendors.

Campers are encouraged to use the electrical pedestals safely and responsibly. The pedestals are checked daily and potential safety hazards are reported to event coordinators for immediate corrective actions. Recommendations may include re-locating campers who share pedestals, removing and replacing hazardous cords, rescinding use of an electrical pedestal, or requiring compensation for repairing damaged pedestals.

1. Parties

This Amendment (the "Amendment") to the Original Contract shown on the Signature and Cover Page for this Amendment (the "Contract") is entered into by and between the Contractor, and the State.

2. Terminology

Except as specifically modified by this Amendment, all terms used in this Amendment that are defined in the Contract shall be construed and interpreted in accordance with the Contract.

3. Amendment Effective Date and Term

A. Amendment Effective Date

This Amendment shall not be valid or enforceable until the Amendment Effective Date shown on the Signature and Cover Page for this Amendment. The State shall not be bound by any provision of this Amendment before that Amendment Effective Date, and shall have no obligation to pay Contractor for any Work performed or expense incurred under this Amendment either before or after the Amendment term shown in §3.B of this Amendment.

B. Amendment Term

The Parties' respective performances under this Amendment and the changes to the Contract contained herein shall commence on the Amendment Effective Date shown on the Signature and Cover Page for this Amendment and shall terminate on the termination of the Contract.

4. Purpose

This Amendment is to update the scope of work and add additional dollars to align with said scope of work for the Prowers County Hotline Contract.

5. Modifications

The Contract and all prior amendments thereto, if any, are modified as follows:

A. The Contract Maximum Amount table on the Contract's Signature and Cover Page is hereby deleted and replaced with the Current Contract Maximum Amount table shown on the Signature and Cover Page for this Amendment.



- C. Exhibit A is hereby deleted and replaced with Exhibit A1 attached per this amendment.
- D. Exhibit B2 is hereby deleted and replaced with Exhibit B3 attached per this amendment.

6. Limits Of Effect and Order of Precedence

This Amendment is incorporated by reference into the Contract, and the Contract and all prior amendments or other modifications to the Contract, if any, remain in full force and effect except as specifically modified in this Amendment. Except for the Special Provisions contained in the Contract, in the event of any conflict, inconsistency, variance, or contradiction between the provisions of this Amendment and any of the provisions of the Contract or any prior modification to the Contract, the provisions of this Amendment shall in all respects supersede, govern, and control. The provisions of this Amendment shall only supersede, govern, and control over the Special Provisions contained in the Contract to the extent that this Amendment specifically modifies those Special Provisions.

Exhibit A-1 – Scope of Work

A. PURPOSE AND SCOPE:

This Inter Governmental Agreement (IGA) is between the Colorado Department of Human Services ("CDHS" or "the Department") and Prowers County (herein referred to as "Contractor" and "HCCC"). Prowers County shall route reporters to the appropriate county when the Child Welfare Abuse and Neglect Routing System's IVR (Integrated Voice Response) system cannot recognize the name of the county spoken by the caller. The Contractor shall be prepared to provide a variety of Telephone Answering Services (Section C.4 below) on behalf of counties.

B. BACKGROUND AND NEED:

Per Colorado Revised Statute ("CRS") 26-5-111, CDHS created a statewide child welfare abuse and neglect reporting hotline ("hotline") to ensure that all citizens of Colorado who observe or become aware of child maltreatment are able to report their concerns easily, 24 hours a day, 7 days a week ("24/7"). The new statewide hotline system will include a helpdesk, referred here into as the Hotline County Connection Center (HCCC), which will provide live call-takers to assist reporters as needed. The HCCC will be a separate entity operated and managed by the Contractor based on the provisions, terms and conditions as set forth in this agreement and associated Statement of Work (SOW).

C. CONTRACTOR'S PERFORMANCE & DELIVERABLES:

1. Deliverables

When reporters call the toll-free statewide hotline (844-CO4-KIDS), reporters will be asked to state the name of a county, and the system will route the call to that county. Any unrecognized county names will result in the caller being routed to the HCCC. Those reporters will be sent to an available HCCC calltaker (Intake Specialist) based on availability and the last time the call-taker received a HCCC call, similar to an automatic call distributor (ACD). Unless otherwise requested by CDHS, the HCCC's primary function will be to route reporters to the appropriate county.

Therefore, the Contractor shall do the following in order to route calls:

- 1. Establish and maintain a location to operate the hotline, including all necessary furniture, computer equipment, emergency backup services, and secure internet access.
- 2. Hire and maintain sufficiently qualified and trained supervisors and call-takers.
 - a. Conduct the following background checks on all HCCC staff:
 - i. Trails Background Check
 - ii. Sex Offender Background Check
 - iii. Drug Screen
 - iv. A criminal history background check proposed by the Contractor and approved by CDHS.
 - v. Local Law Enforcement is an acceptable source.

- 3. Accept telephone calls by live call-takers stationed at a virtual contact center that operates 24 hours a day, 7 days a week
 - a. The HCCC staffing levels shall be adequate to handle call volume according to the customer service requirements articulated in Section 8 of this statement of work.
 - b. Staffing for each shift will be a minimum of two call-takers.
- 4. Utilize computers with internet access to log into, receive calls through, and document call information in the TRAILS database
- 5. Based on a script provided by CDHS, the HCCC will assist reporters by identifying the appropriate county, documenting initial caller information then cold transfer to the appropriate county's child abuse and neglect reporting line (queue).
 - a. Cold transfer is a call transfer in which the HCCC call-taker transfers a call to the designated county number/queue without announcing the call.
- 6. Maintain call handling protocol lists for all 64 counties and 2 tribes.
 - a. The list shall document the hours of operation (including after hours, weekends and holidays), the call handling options for that county or tribe, list of supervisors, appropriate case workers, hotline workers, or other resources as designated by the county or tribe.
- 7. Contractor shall ensure there are no less than two call-takers on duty to receive calls from reporters.
- 8. The Contractor shall comply with the State's information security policies.
- 9. The Contractor shall comply with CDHS' HIPAA Privacy and Security policies.

2. Services to reporters who are deaf or have hearing impairments

- The Contractor shall assist reporters who utilize relay services such as TeleType
 (TTY), Telecommunications Device for the Deaf (TDD), or another emerging technology.
- 2. HCCC call-takers shall be well versed in TTY, TDD, relay services, or other emerging technologies so as to seamlessly provide HCCC services to the reporters who are deaf, hearing impaired or have other impairments to effectively communicate their concerns.

3. Translation Services

In the event that translation services are required, HCCC call-takers will need to conference in
the translation service provider, collect the needed information then transfer the reporter to
the appropriate county advising the county of the language barrier. The State of Colorado has a
preferred vendor for translation services that may be used for this project. Information
regarding the vendor and how to access their services will be provided to the Contractor.

4. Information Gathering Services

 If requested by a county, the Contractor shall provide Telephone Answering Services (also known as Information Gathering services) on behalf of the county department(s) child abuse and neglect hotline on a 24 hours a day basis (seven days a week, including holidays and weekends); after hours only (considered all non-business hours); or on an as-needed basis (temporary while the county is experiencing weather related outages, resource shortages, technical outages and other issues affecting he counties ability to receive calls from reporters).

In these cases, the Contractor shall provide initial review services as defined in Volume 7 Rules (Code of Colorado Regulations 12-CCR-2509-2), and Colorado Revised Statutes, Title 19, the Children's Code. The Contractor shall staff the HCCC with supervisors and call-takers that have received Hotline worker/supervisor training and are certified as a Hotline worker/supervisor through the Child Welfare Training System. A list of certified worker/supervisor shall be made available on request. The HCCC's Hotline certified call-takers shall in these cases, the Contractor shall:

- a. Hire and maintain sufficiently qualified and trained supervisors and call-takers to complete these additional functions.
- b. Collect appropriate information from the reporters as required by CDHS and document in the Trails database.
- c. Notification will be provided to the county following the notification guidelines as established by CDHS and or in Rule.
 - i. During business hours, notify the County of receipt of a child abuse and neglect report via email and document the notification in the Trails database
 - ii. During after-hours (hours outside of the county's normal operating hours), the HCCC will make appropriate documentation then transfer reporters to the noncontracted county's queue.
- d. If the county has contracted for Information Gathering Services (also known as Call Coverage Services) the HCCC will manage the call accordance with the Memorandum of Understanding (MOU) established between the county and the HCCC and confirmed by CDHS.
- e. The Contractor will provide Information Gathering Services for counties once they have been approved by the Department of Human Services Executive Director and have entered into a mutually agreeable MOU that has been reviewed and confirmed by a CDHS Hotline designee.
- f. The HCCC will manage the development of the MOU and work with the county to get the necessary approvals.
- g. The State designated Hotline Staff member must confirm the MOU does not conflict with CDHS protocols, standards, policies and Rule.
- h. Reimbursement for the cost of providing these services will be negotiated and managed between the HCCC and the county via the MOU.
- i. The Contractor will maintain responsibility for ongoing management of the MOU and associated reimbursement processes.
- The Contractor will be given advance notice of a county's request and time to accommodate their request.
- k. Establish rapport with reporters and employ interviewing techniques to gather information related to child abuse and neglect
- Follow notification process as set forth in rule and by CDHS
- m. During business hours, notify the county of receipt of a child abuse and neglect report via email, and/or personal notification when needed.
- During afterhours, call the county to notify them of receipt of a child abuse and neglect report. If county is unavailable, continue to pursue contact, but send an email to ensure

- they do get notice. The email does not replace the need for personal contact during afterhours.
- o. Transfer the referral to the appropriate county in the state automated case management system
- Obtain confirmation from county that the notification of a report referral has been received.
- q. Document the information regarding notification in the Trails system

5. Documentation Requirements

- The Contractor shall utilize the TRAILS database to input information about all calls received through the HCCC. The information that must be captured is outlined in Volume 7 Rules, and as required by CDHS. At minimum the information should include:
 - Is the call related to child welfare?
 - Did the call require relay services for the deaf or hearing impaired?
 - Translation or Language assistance services?
 - Where the call was routed?
- 2. The Contractor shall utilize the Trails database to input information about all reports received through the HCCC via fax or email. The information that must be inputted is outlined in Volume 7 Rules, and as required by CDHS.

6. Training Requirements

- 1. The Contractor shall ensure all call-takers and supervisors are Child Welfare Hotline Certified and such certification must be maintained by meeting the State training requirements.
- 2. The Contractor shall train their personnel in the proper methods and techniques required to properly and satisfactorily accept phone calls, relay information, and employ customer service skills to interact with reporters, state and county staff in a professional and courteous manner.
- 3. The Contractor shall also train call-takers on HIPAA compliance.
- 4. All HCCC call-takers shall be thoroughly trained on the operations of the hotline system's call platform, TRAILS database, and any other system necessary to provide the Services outlined above. HCCC staff must be trained prior to taking calls.
 - a. Training will be available through CDHS.
- 5. If requested by a county, or counties, to provide any type of Telephone Answering Services on their behalf, the Contractor shall ensure it has a sufficient number of Hotline Certified call-takers and supervisors to provide the services articulated above in the back-up initial review services requirement.
 - a. Hotline call-taker/supervisor training will be available through the Child Welfare Training System
- 6. These requirements are subject to change. The Contractor has the ability to access on-going training through the Child Welfare Training System when policy or procedure changes warrant new training. CDHS will negotiate changes with the contractor.

8. Customer Service and Quality Assurance Requirements

- The Contractor and all subcontractors shall be responsible for knowing and being in compliance with applicable Volume 7 rules, as well as Colorado Revised Statutes, Title 19, the Children's Code.
- 2. The Contractor must have a sufficient number of Hotline Certified call-takers available at all times to achieve the goals listed on the following measures on average and during peak call times:
 - a. Answer and attend to all calls within an accumulative average of 60 Seconds
 - b. Ensure call abandonment rate does not exceed the accumulative average of 3%
 - c. Provide notification of a report taken within 2 hours 95% of time.
 - * All three are based on accumulative totals.
- 3. A goals review will occur quarterly, unless an alternate schedule is required by CDHS.
 - a. CDHS may conduct quality assurance reviews of the HCCC's call recordings to assess the HCCC's quality of service.
 - b. The Contractor's performance under this IGA will also be monitored by CDHS for meeting the following criteria, and may involve input from stakeholders:
 - i. **SAFETY**: Degree to which contractor complied with applicable safety regulations for this project as described in the IGA.
 - ii. **CUSTOMER SERVICE**: Degree to which contractor was responsive to CDHS' requests for assistance.
 - iii. **COMPLIANCE:** Degree to which the Contractor conducts work in compliance with applicable Volume 7 Rules.
 - iv. QUALITY: Degree to which products and/or services meet or exceed standards set forth in the IGA, including exhibits and attachments thereto (collectively, "Intergovernmental Agreement or Interagency Agreement").
 - v. **TIMELINESS**: Degree to which contractor supplied products or services within the time frames identified in the IGA.
 - vi. **QUANTITY**: Degree to which the contractor supplied products and services meeting the specifications and in the amounts set forth in the IGA.
 - vii. **FLEXIBILITY:** Degree to which contractor adjusted to CDHS' changing needs.
 - viii. **TECHNOLOGY:** Degree to which contractor utilized current technologies to deliver and support products and services specified in the IGA.
 - ix. **SUPPORT:** Degree to which the HCCC monitored the HCCC number (303-866-3004) and provided support to Counties and/or call-takers experiencing technical difficulties or the need for added services.
 - x. **COST**: Degree to which the Contractor complied with the cost limitations specified in this agreement
 - c. Fiscal Monitoring shall consist of a desk audit of source documentation and previously submitted invoices. The fiscal monitoring shall happen at least once a year. CDHS will provide guidance regarding source documentation and fiscal monitoring guidelines.
 - d. CDHS shall have thirty (30) calendar days from the date that a performance review has been conducted, to evaluate the work. If CDHS believes in good faith that performance fails to meet the specifications, or is otherwise deficient, then CDHS

shall notify the Contractor of the failure or deficiencies in writing within fifteen (15) calendar days of: I) the date the performance, if CDHS is aware of the failure or deficiency at the time; or 2) the date CDHS becomes aware of the failure or deficiency. The above time frame shall apply to all performance and/or deliverables, except for those deliverables that have a different time negotiated in writing pursuant to CDHS' fiscal rules.

- 4. The Contractor shall conduct its own quality assurance reviews by listening in on live calls or call recordings to ensure reporters routed to the HCCC receive timely, efficient, friendly and thorough service.
- 5. If the Contractor is requested to provide Telephone Answering Services (see section C.4), for a count, the Contractor will be held to the same performance expectations as Colorado counties including:
 - a. Timely documentation of information in the statewide Trails database system
 - b. Use of enhanced screening to ascertain risk and protective factors
 - c. Use of other state information systems to search for information relevant to individuals identified in reports of abuse
- 6. The Contractor shall support county call-takers with technical assistance as needed including:
 - a. Troubleshooting the web-based telecommunications and information technology systems utilized for the hotline system.
 - b. Program county business days and hours into the hotline system so that call routing is accurate.
 - c. Build and activate new agent profiles for HCCC and county call-takers.
 - d. Deactivate agent profiles for HCCC and county call-takers as needed.
 - e. Assist call-takers for HCCC and counties with submitting help-desk tickets for telephonic issues when they arise.

9. Telecommunications and Information Technology Requirements

The Contractor shall procure and maintain all equipment necessary to provide the services outlined in statement of work. The information systems referenced in this Contract, such as the Comprehensive Child Welfare Information System, are web-based applications, to which the Contractor will have access depending on the type of service requested by counties.

The Contractor shall meet or exceed the minimum telecommunications and information technology requirements needed to be compatible with the statewide hotline system. These requirements include the following:

- 1. The service provider's telephone system must have direct inward dialing (DID), and each HCCC call-taker must have their own DID numbers.
- 2. Data connectivity requirements include no less than the following:
 - a. HCCC call-takers' bandwidth needs: peak 333Kb, 270Kb Steady State after login
 - b. HCCC supervisors' bandwidth needs: 1200Kb peak and steady state
 - c. Necessary and appropriate applications, browsers and connectivity to perform the functions outlined in this agreement.

- 3. The Contractor shall ensure they are utilizing current technologies and associated applications to be able to receive calls and process them accordingly within the Trails database.
- 4. Maintain current and updated applications and software necessary to meet the requirements of the SOW.
- 5. The Contractor must submit access forms to the Governor's Office of Information Technology ("OIT") for each HCCC call-taker that requires access to the state automated case management system and any other State of Colorado information system needed to provide the services outlined in this Contract. These access forms must be submitted to OIT at least two weeks prior to when the call-taker will need access to the information systems.
- 6. The Contractor shall comply with the State's information security policies.
- 7. The Contractor shall comply with CDHS' HIPAA Privacy and Security policies.

10. Transition Planning

At the end of the IGA period, CDHS reserves the right to transition the HCCC to an alternate service provider or to CDHS. The Contractor shall create and maintain a transition-out plan that clearly describes what is to be done upon agreement of transition. Upon termination of the IGA for any reason, the Contractor shall provide reasonable advance notice and assist the Department in transferring responsibility for providing these services either to an alternative service provider or to the Department itself. The Contractor shall make every effort to ensure the transfer is completed in a manner that prevents reporters or state and county staff from experiencing any interruption in service.

11. Emergency Planning

The Contractor shall develop and keep updated an Emergency Services Plan that ensures operation 365 days a year on a 24-hour basis. The plan shall include specific steps to overcome:

- Power Outages
- Network Outages (telephone lines and trunks, LAN and WAN)
- Telephone Outages
- Resource Shortages (shortage of people to meet performance requirements)
- Computer Outages
- Weather-Related Disasters
- Loss of Facilities

12. Change Management.

The contractor shall:

- 1. Agree that any changes greater than 20% between Non-Personnel Services related budget categories must have prior written approval from the designated CDHS contact responsible for overseeing this agreement.
- Any changes greater than 5% for Personnel Services related budget line items, must have prior
 written approval from the designated CDHS contact responsible for overseeing this agreement must
 have prior written approval from the designated CDHS contact responsible for overseeing this
 agreement.

- 3. Any request for a modification to the budget shall be submitted at least 90 days prior to the end of the contract period and may require an amendment.
- 4. Contractor will provide a projected budget to CDHS no later than January 7th of each year providing detailed explanation for any increases and requests for addition funding. It is understood such requests are not guaranteed, but will be seriously reviewed and addressed by CDHS.

13. Travel Stipulations

Travel is expected to be minimal, and shall be reimbursed at the prevailing state rate.

14. Performance Measures Overview

1. Contract Performance Measures

The parties will identify and agree upon up to 5 Performance Measures for use by the Parties hereunder.

1. Measures:

- a. Answer and attend to all calls within an accumulative average of 60 Seconds.
 - Ensures that reporters can expect to reach a live person in a reasonable amount of time when making a report. This will help prevent reporters from deciding not to leave a report.
 - ii. Help HCCC access whether they need additional resources to answer incoming calls.
- b. Ensure call abandonment rate does not exceed the accumulative average of 3%
 - i. Provides key measure when forecasting the necessary resources to meet the demand to make reports.
- c. Provide notification of a report taken within 2 hours 95% of time.
 - i. Helps with counties meeting their timeliness of response goals by ensuring reports are delivered in a timely manner so they can be properly accessed.
 - * All three are based on accumulative totals.
- 2. As to each Performance Measure, the Contractor shall collect and report to the State within 5 business days of each month for 12 months, performance data utilizing reporting tools, data collection protocols, and forms that are mutually agreed to. At minimum the HCCC will utilize the following format and example:

STATEMENT OF WORK

I. Entity Name: Prowers County Public Health

II. Project Description:

This project supports two complementary public health initiatives that work together to improve the health, safety, and well-being of Colorado children and families.

First, this project advances the Child Fatality Prevention Act (Article 20.5 of Title 25, Colorado Revised Statutes), a statewide, multi-agency effort to prevent child deaths. Pursuant to C.R.S. § 25-20.5-404-405, local public health agencies, or agencies designated by local public health agencies, must establish and coordinate multidisciplinary, local child fatality prevention review teams (local teams). These teams systematically examine child deaths to better understand how and why they occur. Using a public health approach, the review process identifies trends and patterns, recommends actions, and implements strategies that can reduce the risk of future fatalities. This work benefits Colorado by helping communities understand the causes of child deaths, identifying effective prevention services, uncovering service gaps, and recommending changes to laws, policies, and systems that promote safe and healthy development for all children.

Second, the project strengthens Colorado's Maternal and Child Health (MCH) Program, which develops, implements, and evaluates evidence-based local action plans to improve outcomes for women, children, youth, and families. The MCH program includes upstream, population health strategies that improve the lives of the maternal child health population. Every five years, Colorado's MCH Program conducts a state-level needs assessment of the health and well-being of women, children, youth and families to guide state and local public health work and to meet Title V MCH Block Grant requirements. The goal of the assessment is to gather information to understand what issues are facing this population and then to identify seven to ten specific priorities that can be positively impacted by public health work during the next five years. State and local MCH staff use the selected MCH priorities to focus efforts, align resources, and to positively impact the lives of Colorado women or reproductive age (15-44), children and youth including those with special health care needs, and their families.

Together, these initiatives use evidence-based strategies, community partnerships, and systems-level change to prevent child fatalities, address health disparities, and create stronger, healthier futures for Colorado's children and families.

Objective #1: No later than the expiration date of this contract, advance a comprehensive understanding of the circumstances of individual child deaths in Colorado and support equitable strategies at the individual, community, and societal levels to prevent future deaths.

Primary Activity #1: The Contractor shall conduct individual, case-specific, multidisciplinary reviews of all child fatalities assigned to the local team based on coroner jurisdiction.

Sub-Activity #1:

- 1. The Contractor shall access the Death Certificate FTP website on a weekly basis to obtain death certificates for each child fatality case assigned to the local team.
- 2. The Contractor shall gather case records from the coroner's office, law enforcement agencies, county department of human services, hospitals, and other agencies for each child fatality assigned to the local team.
- 3. The Contractor shall abstract critical data from case records and enter the data into the National Center for Fatality Review and Prevention's CRS for each child fatality assigned to the local team.
- 4. The Contractor shall develop case summaries for the purpose of completing the "Narrative" section (Section O) of the National Center for Fatality Review and Prevention's CRS for each child fatality assigned to the local team.
- 5. No later than two (2) months after reviewing a child fatality, the Contractor shall complete data entry for Sections A-O and click "Data entry completed for this case" (in Section P) of the National Center for Fatality Review and Prevention's CRS for each child fatality assigned to the local team.

- 3. Implemented and evaluated equitable child fatality prevention strategies at the state and local

levels.

4. Maintain or increase the health status and needs of the maternal and child population within the Contractor's jurisdiction.

Measurement of Expected Results

- 1. Sections A-O of the National Center for Fatality Review and Prevention's CRS will be completed for 100% of child fatalities that occurred in Colorado and meets CFPS' review criteria within the local team's jurisdiction.

VI. Additional Provisions:

The following terms and conditions are in addition to the standard purchase order terms and conditions and are to be read and interpreted in conjunction with the provisions of the purchase order. Wherever used in the following provisions, "Contractor" and "Vendor" shall have the same meaning. Contractor and/or Vendor — any party to which a Purchase Order is issued.

WHEREAS, the voters of Colorado approved Proposition 123 in 2022 creating the State Affordable Housing Fund to make certain funds available to local governments as defined by CRS-29-32-104; and

WHEREAS, Prowers County is a statutory county duly and regularly organized and validly existing as a body corporate and politic under and by virtue of the Constitution and laws of the State of Colorado; and

WHEREAS, Prowers County has adopted the Prowers County Zoning Regulation and requires zoning permits to be secured from the Prowers County Land Use Department prior to the construction, movement, conversion, extension, enlargement, or structural alteration of buildings of other structures in all Zoning Districts.

WHEREAS, Prowers County has opted to participate in and be eligible for Proposition 123 funding and programs; and

WHEREAS, Prowers County recognizes the importance of allowing and incentivizing affordable housing to be developed for its workforce and residents; and

WHEREAS, Prowers County recognizes that an affordable housing development project which has at least 50% of the units as affordable, as defined in statute (C.R.S. 29-32-101 and C.R.S. 29-32-105(2)(a)) would be eligible for expedited review; and

WHEREAS, Prowers County recognizes the following application types which require expedited review: Site Plan, Zoning Permit, Special Use Permit, Variance or Waiver, or Development Plan, excluding subdivisions, of a development project for which 50% or more of the residential units in the development constitute affordable housing; and

WHEREAS, Prowers County's expedited review process for affordable housing projects does not apply if a developer chooses to opt-out of the process or when the County is the applicant (C.R.S.29-32-105(2)(d); and

WHEREAS, Prowers County recognizes the allowable extensions in C.R.S. 29-32-105(2)(b), both for applicants and for the County, and recognizes the circumstances under which the expedited review timeline may be extended or the application may be removed from the expedited review process; and

WHEREAS, Prowers County has created a policy for affordable housing projects with at least 50% of units affordable to be fast tracked by being scheduled for the next available public hearing and a decision rendered within 90 days of a complete application and proper public noticing being completed unless an extension is requested by the applicant, in alignment with CRS-29-32-105(2) et seq.

NOW THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED BY THE BOARD OF COUNTY COMMISSIONERS OF PROWERS COUNTY, COLORADO THAT:

1. The Board creates the following policy to implement a system to expedite the development review process for affordable housing, as affordable housing is defined in Chapter 10 of the Prowers County Zoning Regulation in accordance with Proposition 123 requirements. The Board establishes a formal policy that any complete application received by the County for an affordable housing development will be placed on the next available agenda once proper public notice has been posted and a decision rendered on the application within 90 days to ensure an expedited and timely review of the affordable housing project, with the intent to comply with the requirements in C.R.S. 29-32-105(2) et seq.

Through the project, the Colorado Department of Early Childhood and project partners shall shift focus from a reactive child protection system to an intentional coordinated primary prevention system co-designed with communities and families, including those with lived child welfare expertise. This Amendment extends the term, increases funds for Federal Fiscal Year (FFY) 26 and modifies Exhibits A, B, C, and D.

5. **MODIFICATIONS**

The Agreement and all prior amendments thereto, if any, are modified as follows:

INTRODUCTION/BACKGROUND

The Colorado Department of Early Childhood (CDEC) was awarded a \$3.7 million Family Support through Primary Prevention (FSPP) Grant by the U.S. Department of Health and Human Services' Administration for Children and Families, Children's Bureau. The grant provides services across five counties, Adams, Boulder, Denver, Jefferson, and Prowers, in Colorado and is designed to serve 14,725 families through local county human services, public health, health care systems, and family resource center partnership sites.

Target Population: Families and children in the target areas of Adam, Prowers, Jefferson, Boulder, and Denver counties that need preventive community-based family support systems to improve wellbeing, equity, and reduce child maltreatment.



The project shall create the conditions necessary for all families to thrive in five counties in Colorado where a significant portion of the population is impacted by disparities in the social determinants of health. Through the project, CDEC and project partners shall shift focus from a reactive child protection system to an intentional coordinated primary prevention system co-designed with communities and families, including those with lived child welfare expertise.

SCOPE OF WORK

Through a subcontract with The Cornerstone Resource Center (TCRC), this scope of work shall include a 5-month planning period to develop a collaborative Strengthening Families Plan to align efforts between Prowers County and The Cornerstone Resource Center, as well as other key stakeholders including families with lived experience. The plan shall include the creation of a No Wrong Door (NWD) approach to improving equitable access to the services and supports families need through collaboration family resource center hub model. Implementation of the plan shall take place in the last 3 months of Year 1 of this project. Years 2-5 of this project shall be focused on implementation of the plan as well as on-going continuous quality improvement adjustments as informed by evaluation.

Additional Provisions

1. SERVICE PROVISIONS

A. The Grantee shall provide the services according to the plans submitted in the "Statement of Work", attached and incorporated herein by this reference as EXHIBIT A. In all cases, the descriptions, plans, timetables, tasks, duties, and responsibilities of the Grantee as described in the Statement of Work, shall be adhered to in the performance of the requirements of this Grant. In the event of a conflict, the terms and conditions of this Grant shall control over the Statement of Work. Any significant changes to the Statement of Work (SOW) require an amendment to the Grant.

2. GOALS AND OBJECTIVES

A. The Grantee shall be responsible for the achievement of any goals and objectives as specified within the Statement of Work (EXHIBIT A) of this Grant unless written notice of any modifications are furnished by the State to the Grantee allowing adequate time for compliance during the term of this Grant.

3. COPY OF SUBCONTRACT

A. The Grantee shall provide to the State a copy of any executed subcontract between the Grantee and any provider of services to fulfill any requirements of this Grant. Subcontracts shall be emailed to the Grant Representative upon execution.

4. PAYMENT

- A. In consideration of the provision of services and reporting and subject to all payment and price provisions and further subject to verification by the State of full and satisfactory compliance with the terms of this Grant Agreement, the State shall pay to the Grantee an amount not to exceed the amount specified in the Budget (EXHIBIT B), of this Grant Agreement.
- B. The Grantee shall submit requests for payment to the <u>OnBase Invoice Submission Process</u> no less than monthly on forms prescribed and provided by the State.

- **C.** Payment shall be made on a cost reimbursement basis for services rendered.
- **D.** It is understood any vacancy savings in the personnel category and/or any savings in any other category shall require written approval from the State prior to any redistribution of any savings by the Grantee. ANY COST SAVINGS THAT ARE REDISTRIBUTED BY GRANTEE WITHOUT WRITTEN APPROVAL SHALL NOT BE REIMBURSED BY THE STATE.
- E. IT IS UNDERSTOOD ANY COSTS THAT EXCEED THE GRANTED AMOUNT SHALL NOT BE PAID BY THE COLORADO DEPARTMENT OF EARLY CHILDHOOD (CDEC). If Grantee has a legitimate need for additional funds, the Grantee shall request additional funds from the CDEC 60 days prior to projected depletion of Granted funds. CDEC shall review each request and notify Grantee in writing of approval or denial. Approval of additional funds shall require an official modification to the Grant Agreement by Amendment or Option Letter.
- F. Timely Invoicing Invoices shall be submitted no later than 30 days following the last day of the month.
 - Final invoices for services provided in September shall be submitted no later than 30 days following the last day of the month.
- G. The Grantee shall maintain source documentation to support all payment requested pursuant to this Grant Agreement. All source documentation shall be provided to the State by the Grantee upon request.
- H. It is understood that the State reserves the right to offset funds pursuant to this Grant Agreement based on the discovery of overpayment or improper use of funds by the Grantee. Overpayment or improper use of funds is interpreted to apply to specific terms of prior year Grant Agreements and includes without limitation requirements of the Generally Accepted Accounting Principles (GAAP) issued by the American Institute of Certified Public Accountants, and applicable sections of the Colorado Revised Statutes.
- I. The State shall review monthly invoices throughout the fiscal year. If, after a number of months, the State determines the Grantee is not needing/using the funding allocated for the Grantee's work in the Grant Agreement, the State shall remove these funds from the Grant Agreement budget by Option Letter for a proportional reduction of services with prior written notification to the Grantee. This provision does not allow for a reduction in the rate of pay. Additionally, the state shall have the ability to issue this option letter for a reduction, allowing the vendor to submit a revised budget for CDEC approval that aligns with the reduction within 30 days.

5. PARTICIPATION

A. The Grantee representative(s) is required to participate in any Department of Early Childhood sponsored meetings related to this Grant Agreement.



6. SUPPLANTING

A. Payments made to the Grantee under this Grant Agreement shall supplement and not supplant other state, local or federal expenditures for services associated with this Grant Agreement.

7. BUDGET CHANGES

- A. Grantee may request in writing adjustments to the direct costs in the current year budget (EXHIBIT B) not to exceed 15% of the total budget. Requests shall be made in the form of a written budget revision request to the appropriate program staff. Written approval for the budget revision shall be required prior to any changes to the budget related to the budget revision request. The total dollar amount of the Grant Agreement budget cannot be changed as a result of the budget revision request. Budget adjustment requests over 15%, adding new expense lines, and/or changes to the total dollar amount of the budget require a formal amendment. No adjustments to the Indirect Costs portion of the budget are allowable without a formal amendment.
- B. Grantee may request in writing up to a 5% increase to the "Gross or Annual Salary" of an individual employee if a position currently listed in the Grant Agreement becomes vacant and the new incoming employee shall be hired at a higher or lower salary. No increase within the salary range is authorized without prior written approval from CDEC. Adding additional staff requires an amendment to the Grant Agreement. Vacancy savings cannot be used to change salary amounts for existing personnel without an amendment. Any change to personnel, including revisions to allow payments for personnel covering vacancies, requires prior written approval from CDEC staff. This process shall never change the Grant Agreement Maximum Amount. Grantee must use available unused funds from either vacancy savings or another category within the Grant Agreement. The revision request may not at any time compromise the integrity of the funded program as determined by CDEC program staff.

C. OPTION LETTER

- i. Option Letter to modify existing State Grant Agreement Rates as listed in the executed Grant Agreement as follows:
 - a) The State, at its discretion, shall have the option to revise the budget over 15% to correct typographical errors; add or remove lines within the budget; increase gross or annual salary of positions listed under Personnel; revisions to personnel; changes between lines of the budget that exceed 15%; and changes to negotiated indirect rates through an Option Letter. In order to exercise this option, the State shall obtain an email agreeing to the changes and follow up with written notice to Grantee in a form substantially equivalent to the Sample Option Letter attached to this Grant Agreement, and any new rates table or exhibit shall be effective as of the effective date of that notice unless the notice provides for a different date.



b) The Option Letter shall not be allowed for changes in the Statement of Work.

8. TRAVEL

- A. Travel costs must be listed in Exhibit B Budget under travel including airfare, hotel, mileage and per diem costs.
- **B.** Mileage shall not exceed the Federal mileage rate per https://www.gsa.gov/travel-resources.
- C. Per Diem shall not exceed Federal General Services Administration (GSA) per diem rates for the area of travel per https://www.gsa.gov/travel-resources.
- **D.** Hotel rates cannot exceed any rate established for conference attendance.
- **E.** Usage of airfare or Out of State Travel requires pre-approval from CDEC.

9. SUBRECIPIENT

A. Grantees determined to be a Sub-recipient of federal funds shall complete the sub-recipient performance report and assessment survey at:

https://forms.gle/QTXGEabvipymdsfd8 upon Grant Agreement execution. Failure to complete the performance report and assessment survey shall delay payment to the Grantee.

10. CRITICAL INCIDENT REPORTING

A. Within 48 hours of the occurrence of a critical incident involving any child or family and/or an on-duty agency staff member of any family support program staff funded through the Department of Early Childhood (CDEC), the agency must report in writing the details of the critical incident to the CDEC Program Manager for the involved family support program. Critical incidents may include, but are not limited to, awareness of an egregious incident of abuse and/or neglect, near fatality, or fatality of any child currently enrolled in a family support program; involuntary termination of a program staff's employment; criminal allegations involving program staff and related to his/her employment; negative media attention about the family support program; any major injury or threat to the security of an agency staff member while on duty and visiting an enrolled child or family.

11. MANDATED REPORTING

A. All program staff are required by law to report suspected child abuse and neglect. Mandatory reporters must report suspected child abuse and neglect to the local county child welfare agency, the local law enforcement agency, or by calling the child abuse reporting hotline system at 1-844-CO-4KIDS (1-844-264-5437).



B. All program staff are required to take the online mandatory reporter training on the Colorado Department of Human Services (CDHS) Child Welfare Training System: https://www.coloradocwts.com/mandated-reporter-training.

12. GIFT CARDS

A. To comply with CDEC policies and federal guidelines, purchasing gift cards with funds from CDEC Grant Agreement funds is not allowed. Please see Code of Federal Regulations (CFR) citations 45CFR75.406 and 45CFR75.302.A for more information.

13. SAM.GOV REQUIREMENT

- A. - produced in the United States (including but not limited to iron, aluminum, steel, cement, and other manufactured products). The requirements of this section must be included in all subawards including all contracts and purchase orders for work or products under this award.
- 8.3 Procurement of Recovered Materials. If a Subrecipient is a State Agency or an agency of a political subdivision of the State, its contractors must comply with section 6002 of the Solid Waste Disposal Act, as amended by the Resource Conservation and Recovery Act. The requirements of Section 6002 include procuring only items designated in guidelines of the Environmental Protection Agency (EPA) at 40 CFR part 247, that contain the highest percentage of recovered materials practicable, consistent with maintaining a satisfactory level of competition, where the purchase price of the item exceeds \$10,000 or the value of the quantity acquired during the preceding fiscal year exceeded \$10,000; procuring solid waste management services in a manner that maximizes energy and resource recovery; and establishing an affirmative procurement program for procurement of recovered materials identified in the EPA guidelines.

9. Access to Records.

- 9.1 A Subrecipient shall permit Recipient/Prime Recipient and its auditors to have access to Subrecipient's records and financial statements as necessary for Recipient to meet the requirements of 2 CFR 200.311-200.332 (Requirements for pass-through entities), 2 CFR 200.300 (Statutory and national policy requirements) through 2 CFR 200.309 (Modification to period of performance), 2 CFR 200.337 (Access to Records) and Subpart F-Audit Requirements of the Uniform Guidance.
- 9.2 A Subrecipient must collect, transmit, and store information related to this Subaward in open and machine-readable formats (2 CFR 200.336).

10. Single Audit Requirements.

- 10.1 If a Subrecipient expends \$1,000,000 or more in Federal Awards during the Subrecipient's fiscal year, the Subrecipient shall procure or arrange for a single or program-specific audit conducted for that year in accordance with the provisions of Subpart F-Audit Requirements of the Uniform Guidance, issued pursuant to the Single Audit Act Amendments of 1996, (31 U.S.C. 7501-7507). 2 CFR 200.501.
- 10.2 Election. A Subrecipient shall have a single audit conducted in accordance with Uniform Guidance 2 CFR 200.514 (Scope of audit), except when it elects to have a program-specific audit conducted in accordance with 2 CFR 200.507 (Program-specific audits). The Subrecipient may elect to have a program-specific audit if Subrecipient expends Federal Awards under only one Federal program (excluding research and development) and the Federal program's statutes, regulations, or the terms and conditions of the Federal award do not require a financial statement audit of Prime Recipient. A program-specific audit may not be elected for research

- and development unless all of the Federal Awards expended were received from Recipient and Recipient approves in advance a program-specific audit.
- 10.3 Exemption. If a Subrecipient expends less than \$1,000,000 in Federal Awards during its fiscal year, the Subrecipient shall be exempt from Federal audit requirements for that year, except as noted in 2 CFR 200.503 (Relation to other audit requirements), but records shall be available for review or audit by appropriate officials of the Federal agency, the State, and the Government Accountability Office.
- 10.4 Subrecipient Compliance Responsibility. A Subrecipient shall procure or otherwise arrange for the audit required by Subpart F of the Uniform Guidance and ensure it is properly performed and submitted when due in accordance with the Uniform Guidance. Subrecipient shall prepare appropriate financial statements, including the schedule of expenditures of Federal awards in accordance with 2 CFR 200.510 (Financial statements) and provide the auditor with access to personnel, accounts, books, records, supporting documentation, and other information as needed for the auditor to perform the audit required by Uniform Guidance Subpart F-Audit Requirements.

11. Contract/Grant Provisions for Subrecipient Contracts.

- 11.1 In addition to other provisions required by the Federal Awarding Agency or the Prime Recipient, Contractors/Grantees that are Subrecipients shall comply with the following provisions. Subrecipients shall include all of the following applicable provisions in all subcontracts entered into by it pursuant to this Contract/Grant.
- 11.2 {Applicable to federally assisted construction contracts.} Equal Employment Opportunity. Except as otherwise provided under 41 CFR Part 60, all contracts that meet the definition of "federally assisted construction contract" in 41 CFR Part 60-1.3 shall include the equal opportunity clause provided under 41 CFR 60-1.4(b), in accordance with Executive Order 11246, "Equal Employment Opportunity" (30 FR 12319, 12935, 3 CFR Part, 1964-1965 Comp., p. 339), as amended by Executive Order 11375, "Amending Executive Order 11246 Relating to Equal Employment Opportunity," and implementing regulations at 41 CFR part 60, Office of Federal Contract Compliance Programs, Equal Employment Opportunity, Department of Labor.
- 11.3 (Applicable to on-site employees working on government-funded construction, alteration and repair projects.) Davis-Bacon Act. Davis-Bacon Act, as amended (40 U.S.C. 3141-3148).
- 11.4 Rights to Inventions Made Under a contract/grant or agreement. If the Federal Award meets the definition of "funding agreement"/ "funding Contract" under 37 CFR 401.2 (a) and the Prime Recipient or Subrecipient wishes to enter into a contract with a small business firm or nonprofit organization regarding the substitution of parties, assignment or performance of experimental,

- developmental, or research work under that "funding agreement,"/"funding Contract", the Prime Recipient or Subrecipient must comply with the requirements of 37 CFR Part 401, "Rights to Inventions Made by Nonprofit Organizations and Small Business Firms Under Government Grants, Contracts and Cooperative Agreements," and any implementing regulations issued by the Federal Awarding Agency.
- 11.5 Clean Air Act (42 U.S.C. 7401-7671q.) and the Federal Water Pollution Control Act (33 U.S.C. 1251-1387), as amended. Contracts and subgrants of amounts in excess of \$150,000 must contain a provision that requires the non-Federal awardee(s) to agree to comply with all applicable standards, orders or regulations issued pursuant to the Clean Air Act (42 U.S.C. 7401-7671q) and the Federal Water Pollution Control Act as amended (33 U.S.C. 1251-1387). Violations must be reported to the Federal Awarding Agency and the Regional Office of the Environmental Protection Agency (EPA).
- 11.6 Debarment and Suspension (Executive Orders 12549 and 12689). A contract award (see 2 CFR 180.220) must not be made to parties listed on the government wide exclusions in the System for Award Management (SAM), in accordance with the OMB guidelines at 2 CFR 180 that implement Executive Orders 12549 (3 CFR part 1986 Comp., p. 189) and 12689 (3 CFR part 1989 Comp., p. 235), "Debarment and Suspension." SAM Exclusions contains the names of parties debarred, suspended, or otherwise excluded by agencies, as well as parties declared ineligible under statutory or regulatory authority other than Executive Order 12549.
- 11.7 Byrd Anti-Lobbying Amendment (31 U.S.C. 1352). Contractors that apply or bid for an award exceeding \$100,000 must file the required certification. Each tier certifies to the tier above that it will not and has not used Federal appropriated funds to pay any person or organization for influencing or attempting to influence an officer or employee of any agency, a member of Congress, officer or employee of Congress, or an employee of a member of Congress in connection with obtaining any Federal contract, grant or any other award covered by 31 U.S.C. 1352. Each tier must also disclose any lobbying with non-Federal funds that takes place in connection with obtaining any Federal award. Such disclosures are forwarded from tier to tier up to the non-Federal award.
- 11.8 Never contract with the enemy (2 CFR 200.215). Federal awarding agencies and recipients are subject to the regulations implementing "Never contract with the enemy" in 2 CFR part 183. The regulations in 2 CFR part 183 affect covered contracts, grants and cooperative agreements that are expected to exceed \$50,000 during the period of performance, are performed outside the United States and its territories, and are in support of a contingency operation in which members of the Armed Forces are actively engaged in hostilities.

- 11.10 Collection of Unallowable Costs (2CFR 200.410). Payments made for costs determined to be unallowable by either the awarding Federal agency, cognizant agency for indirect costs, or pass-through entity must be refunded with interest to the Federal Government. Unless directed by Federal statute or regulation, repayments must be made in accordance with the instructions provided by the Federal agency or pass-through entity that made the allowability determination. - 11.11 Whistle Blower Protections. An employee of a subrecipient must not be discharged, demoted, or otherwise discriminated against as a reprisal for disclosing to a person or body described in paragraph (a)(2) of 41 U.S.C. 4712 information that the employee reasonably believes is evidence of gross mismanagement of a Federal contract or grant, a gross waste of Federal funds, an abuse of authority relating to a Federal contract or grant, a substantial and specific danger to public health or safety, or a violation of law, rule, or regulation related to a Federal contract (including the competition for or negotiation of a contract) or grant. The subrecipient must inform their employees in writing of employee whistleblower rights and protections under 41 U.S.C. 4712. See statutory requirements for whistleblower protections at 10 U.S.C. 4701, 41 U.S.C. 4712, 41 U.S.C. 4304, and 10 U.S.C. 4310.

12. Certifications.

12.1 Unless prohibited by Federal statutes or regulations, Recipient/Prime Recipient may require Subrecipient to submit certifications and representations required by Federal statutes or regulations on an annual basis. 2 CFR 200.415. Submission may be required more frequently if Subrecipient fails to meet a requirement of the Federal award. Subrecipient shall certify in writing to the State at the end of the Award that the project or activity was completed or the level of effort was expended. If the required level of activity or effort was not carried out, the amount of the Award must be adjusted.

13. Exemptions.

- 13.1 These Federal Provisions do not apply to an individual who receives an Award as a natural person, unrelated to any business or non-profit organization he or she may own or operate in his or her name.
- 13.2 A Contractor/Grantee with gross income from all sources of less than \$300,000 in the previous tax year is exempt from the requirements to report Subawards and the Total Compensation of its most highly compensated Executives.

14. Event of Default and Termination.

- 14.1 Failure to comply with these Federal Provisions shall constitute an event of default under the Contract/Grant and the State of Colorado may terminate the Contract/Grant upon 30 days prior written notice if the default remains uncured five calendar days following the termination of the 30-day notice period. This remedy will be in addition to any other remedy available to the State of Colorado under the Contract/Grant, at law or in equity.
- 14.2 Termination (2 CFR 200.340). The Federal Award may be terminated in whole or in part as follows:
 - 14.2.1 By the Federal Awarding Agency or Pass-through Entity, if a Non-Federal Entity fails to comply with the terms and conditions of a Federal Award:
 - 14.2.2 By the Federal awarding agency or Pass-through Entity with the consent of the Non-Federal Entity, in which case the two parties must agree upon the termination conditions, including the effective date and, in the case of partial termination, the portion to be terminated;
 - 14.2.3 By the Non-Federal Entity upon sending to the Federal Awarding Agency or Pass-through Entity written notification setting forth the reasons for such termination, the effective date, and, in the case of partial termination, the portion to be terminated. However, if the Federal Awarding Agency or Pass-through Entity determines in the case of partial termination that the reduced or modified portion of the Federal Award or Subaward will not accomplish the purposes for which the Federal Award was made, the Federal Awarding Agency or Pass-through Entity may terminate the Federal Award in its entirety; or
 - 14.2.4 By the Federal Awarding Agency or Pass-through Entity pursuant to termination provisions included in the Federal Award.

15. Additional Terms re Payments to Grantee to Supplement Main Terms in Contract.

- 15.1 Federal Recovery: The closeout of a Federal Award does not affect the right of the Federal Awarding Agency or the State to disallow costs and recover funds on the basis of a later audit or other review. Any cost disallowance recovery is to be made within the Record Retention Period, as defined below.
- 15.2 Close-Out: Grantee shall close out this Award within 45 days after the Fund Expenditure End Date shown on the Signature and Cover Page for this Agreement. To complete closeout, Grantee shall submit to the State all deliverables (including documentation) as defined in this Agreement and Grantee's final reimbursement request or invoice. The State will withhold 5% of allowable costs until all final documentation has been submitted and accepted by the State as substantially

complete. If the Federal Awarding Agency has not closed this Federal Award within one year and 90 days after the Fund Expenditure End Date shown on the Signature and Cover Page for this Agreement due to Grantee's failure to submit required documentation, then Grantee may be prohibited from applying for new Federal Awards through the State until such documentation is submitted and accepted.

Idemia Identity & Security USA, LLC SERVICES AGREEMENT

This Services Agreement ("Agreement") is entered into as of the 16th day of September, 2025 ("Effective Date"), by and between Idemia Identity & Security USA, LLC a Delaware limited liability company, with its principal office at 11951 Freedom Drive, Suite 1800, Reston, VA 20190 USA ("IDEMIA") and, Board of County Commissioners, having an office at 103 East Oak St. Lamar, CO 81052 ("Service Provider").

WHEREAS: IDEMIA is the prime contractor under a contract to provide biometric identification services for one or more government agencies; and

WHEREAS: IDEMIA has requested Service Provider to provide biometric identification services as IDEMIA's subcontractor and Service Provider agrees to provide such services under the terms and conditions of this Agreement.

NOW, THEREFORE, the Parties agree as follows:

1. **DEFINITIONS**

For purposes of this Agreement the following terms shall have the following meanings:

- A) "Agency" and "Agencies" shall mean the government agency identified in Attachment A and to which IDEMIA transmits an Applicant's biometric and biographic information.
- B) "Applicant(s)" shall mean those individuals who have their biometric and biographic information transmitted to the Agency.
- C) "Applicant Fees" shall mean any fees due from Applicants, as specified in the SOW, or as otherwise communicated by IDEMIA to Service Provider from time to time.
- D) "Fees" shall mean those fees specified in Attachment A for Service Provider's provision of Services.
- E) "Prime Contract" shall mean the contract between IDEMIA and one or more government entities, or between IDEMIA and its higher-tier contractor, in support of a contract with one or more government entities.
- F) "Services" shall mean those services described in Attachment A or any subsequent SOW executed by the parties.
- G) "Statement of Work" or "SOW" shall mean Attachment A to this Agreement and any statement of work subsequently executed by the parties or any amendment to this Agreement to identify Services and set forth any additional terms and conditions. Should the SOW include any terms that are more stringent or restrictive than those of this Agreement, the terms of the SOW shall control.

2. SERVICES

1

In consideration of IDEMIA's payment to Service Provider of the Fees, Service Provider hereby agrees to provide the Services in accordance with the terms and conditions of this Agreement and of all Attachments and Schedules hereto and any SOW, which shall be deemed incorporated into, and made a part of, this Agreement by this reference. Service Provider hereby agrees that IDEMIA may identify Service Provider as a subcontractor and provide relevant contact information in any proposals or bids IDEMIA submits for Prime Contracts or renewals thereof. IDEMIA may, from time to time, upon mutual written agreement (email is sufficient), license office space from Service Provider in order for IDEMIA employees to perform services that are the same or similar to Services. Service Provider will not receive any compensation under this Agreement for such services performed by IDEMIA employees or for the license of office space.

3. REMITTANCE OF APPLICANT FEES; TAXES

- A) Service Provider will collect and remit Applicant Fees to IDEMIA on a daily basis. All Applicant Fees are non-refundable and shall be remitted by Service Provider without any right of setoff or deduction. Where remittance of collected Applicant Fees is routinely late, IDEMIA may, at its sole discretion, deduct collected Applicant Fees from Fees paid to Service Provider upon 30 days written notice to Service Provider.
- B) In jurisdictions where Applicant Fees are subject to sales or other taxes, IDEMIA will include such taxes within Applicant Fees. The Service Provider will collect and remit any such taxes to IDEMIA with the Applicant Fees. Service Provider is solely responsible for the reporting, collection, and /or remittance of all other taxes and governmental fees associated with Service Provider's business.

4. PAYMENT TO SERVICE PROVIDER

IDEMIA agrees to pay Service Provider the Fees set forth in Attachment A within forty-five (45) days of the last day of the month in which the relevant Services were performed. Should Service Provider agree to accept payment via ACH (Automated Clearing House), IDEMIA agrees to pay Service Provider the Fees set forth in Attachment A within Thirty (30) days of the last day of the month in which the relevant Services were performed.

5. EQUIPMENT

IDEMIA will provide Service Provider with all required hardware and software to perform Services, free of lease or charge, which may include a Livescan device, computer, monitor, printer, check scanner, router and required cabling ("Equipment"). Service Provider agrees that any Equipment provided by IDEMIA shall remain the sole property of IDEMIA and shall be used exclusively for the performance of Services. IDEMIA will maintain and support the Equipment at no charge to Service Provider, except as otherwise provided in this Agreement. Service Provider agrees to use best efforts to keep the equipment in good working order. If any Equipment is lost or damaged while in the possession of Service Provider, IDEMIA may invoice Service Provider for the replacement value thereof or deduct the replacement value from Fees.

6. CONFIDENTIALITY

A) "Confidential Information" means all information or material disclosed by one party hereto ("Discloser") in any manner, whether orally, visually or in tangible form, to the other party hereto ("Recipient"), or otherwise discovered by or made available to Recipient. Confidential Information includes, but is not limited to, the following types of information: any information collected by Applicants, software (in various stages of development), designs, drawings, specifications, models, source code, object code, know-how,

techniques, documentation, diagrams, flow charts, marketing and development plans, business plans, financial information, customer lists, and other similar information and intellectual property that is proprietary to and confidential information of Discloser, and all copies, descriptions and summaries thereof, whether created by Discloser or Recipient. In the course of disclosing Confidential Information to the Recipient, Discloser shall endeavor to identify such information as "confidential", but failure to so identify such information as confidential shall not relieve Recipient of its obligations hereunder. Confidential Information shall not include information that: (a) is already known to Recipient without restriction on use or disclosure prior to receipt of such information from Discloser; (b) is or becomes part of the public domain other than by breach of this Agreement by Recipient; (c) is developed by Recipient independently of and without use of or reference to any of Discloser's Confidential Information; or (d) is received by Recipient from a third party who is not under any obligation to Discloser to maintain the confidentiality of such information. For the avoidance of doubt, all information provided by Applicants, the terms of this Agreement and the existence of any business relationship between the parties, shall be deemed Confidential Information.

- B) All Confidential Information disclosed by Discloser shall remain the sole property of Discloser. Nothing herein shall be construed as a grant by Discloser to Recipient or any third party of any license, directly or by implication, estoppel or otherwise, in any Confidential Information. Nothing contained herein shall create any obligation on the part of Discloser to provide Recipient with any Confidential Information.
- C) Discloser hereby authorizes Recipient to use Confidential Information solely for the purpose of performance of this Agreement and for no other purpose whatsoever. Such authorization shall automatically expire upon expiration or termination of this Agreement for any reason. Recipient covenants and agrees that it shall disclose, permit the disclosure of or allow access to Confidential Information to only those of its employees who (a) have a need to know such Confidential Information and (b) have executed written confidentiality agreements with obligations of confidentiality and restrictions on use substantially similar to those herein. Recipient agrees that in no event shall any other employee of Recipient or any third party, including but not limited to affiliates, customers and contractors of Recipient, have access or exposure to Confidential Information without the express written consent of Discloser.
- D) Recipient agrees that it will handle Confidential Information with the same degree of care it takes to safeguard its own confidential information of a like nature, but in no event less than a reasonable degree of care, and will not use, disclose or make available, directly or indirectly, any Confidential Information to any person, concern or entity, except as expressly permitted hereunder.
- E) Recipient shall notify Discloser immediately upon discovery of any unauthorized use or disclosure of Confidential Information or any other breach of this Agreement by Recipient or its employees, and will cooperate with Discloser in every reasonable way to help Discloser regain possession of the Confidential Information and prevent its further unauthorized use or disclosure.
- F) Recipient shall not create derivative works from, reverse engineer, decompile or disassemble any software code and/or pre-release hardware devices disclosed by Discloser to the Recipient under the terms of this Agreement, except as expressly permitted by applicable law.
- G) Notwithstanding any other provision of this Agreement, Recipient may disclose Confidential Information in response to a valid order of a court, regulatory agency, or other governmental body in the United States

or any political subdivision thereof, but only to the limited extent and for the limited purposes stated in such order; provided, however, that Recipient shall first notify Discloser in writing of the order and cooperate with Discloser if Discloser desires to seek an appropriate protective order.

- H) All Confidential Information, copies and summaries thereof shall be returned to Discloser within ten (10) days of Discloser's request. At Discloser's option, Confidential Information, including all copies, may instead be destroyed by Recipient, provided Recipient certifies such destruction in writing to Discloser within five (5) days of Discloser's instructions to Recipient. This obligation survives expiration or termination of this Agreement.
- I) It is agreed that due to the sensitive and highly valuable proprietary information contained in Confidential Information, Discloser would suffer irreparable harm from the unauthorized disclosure or use of Confidential Information. Accordingly, either party may seek injunctive relief from any court of competent jurisdiction if necessary to preserve the status quo or otherwise prevent irreparable harm from the unauthorized disclosure or use of its Confidential Information pending final resolution of a decision on the merits with respect to such disclosure or use. In the event any party takes legal action to enforce any of the terms of this Agreement, the unsuccessful party to such action shall pay the successful party's expenses, including actual attorneys' fees, incurred in such action.

7. NON-SOLICITATION; NON-COMPETE

- A) Service Provider agrees that during the term of this Agreement and for a period of two (2) years following the expiration or termination of this Agreement, regardless of the reason for termination and regardless of which party terminates, except as otherwise permitted in advance in writing by IDEMIA, Service Provider shall not: (a) divert or attempt to divert from IDEMIA any business of IDEMIA; (b) perform any services which are related or similar to the Services for any person or entity other than IDEMIA, which duty shall be interpreted as broadly as allowed under law to prevent Service Provider from interfering with IDEMIA's business opportunities and to prevent Service Provider from competing against IDEMIA or assisting other persons or entities to perform work which has the effect of reducing the work available to IDEMIA; or (c) otherwise interfere with IDEMIA's (or its subsidiaries' or affiliates') employee relationships, or with IDEMIA's customer or vendor relationships.
- B) For the duration of the Agreement, Service Provider, and its employees, shall not, directly or indirectly, solicit for hire any person being fingerprinted for a background check at the direction of a prospective or current employer while: (a) performing any and all services under this Agreement; or (b) representing IDEMIA in any capacity.
- C) In addition to other remedies available to it at law, including without limitation, monetary damages, IDEMIA shall be entitled to injunctive and other equitable relief in the event of Service Provider's breach of this Section 7.

8. WARRANTIES

A) If required by Agency or IDEMIA, Service Provider represents and warrants that all employees and contractors of Service Provider, who collect, submit or otherwise process biometric or biographic information of Applicants will if required by the applicable Prime Contract, i) have passed a criminal background check (written pass/fail criteria for adjudication thereof shall be as specified in the applicable

SOW), a social security number verification, and a validation of the identification documents presented by the employee or contractor. Subsections (i) and (ii) hereof are collectively "Background Check Requirements." Service Provider shall be responsible for the costs of compliance with Background Check Requirements, and IDEMIA may deduct such costs from Fees. Service Provider shall provide satisfactory evidence of a specific employee or contractor meeting Background Check Requirements, upon IDEMIA's request.

- B) For purposes of this Section 8, all individuals subject to Background Check Requirements shall hereinafter be referred to as "Restricted Personnel." Service Provider will not use Restricted Personnel in performance of this Agreement until after IDEMIA's Chief Security Officer has notified Service Provider in writing that such Restricted Personnel meet Background Check Requirements. It shall be a material breach of this Agreement by Service Provider if any Restricted Personnel begin to perform under this Agreement before IDEMIA has provided such notification.
- C) Service Provider further represents and warrants that:
 - i) Services will be performed in a timely, professional and workman-like manner and will conform to the specifications stated in the applicable SOW; and
 - ii) Service Provider shall comply with all federal, state and local laws and regulations and any terms identified in the SOW as a Prime Contract Flow-Down Term. Should any terms identified in the SOW as Prime Contract Flow-Down Terms conflict with any terms of this Agreement, the terms identified as Prime Contract Flow-Down Terms shall control.

9. INSURANCE

Service Provider agrees to obtain and maintain umbrella liability and General Public liability insurance with minimum limits of \$1,000,000.00 per occurrence for the entire duration of this Agreement. Service Provider further agrees to obtain and maintain workers' compensation insurance with at least the statutory required minimums for coverage as well as other state and federally mandated insurance coverage. Service Provider agrees to provide to IDEMIA a certificate of insurance evidencing the coverage required by this Section 9 and naming IDEMIA as an additional insured upon request.

10. INDEMNIFICATION

Each party ("Indemnifying Party") shall defend and indemnify the other, and their respective officers, directors, employees, and agents (the "Indemnified Party") from and against all claims, demands, actions, causes of action, liabilities, damages, costs and expenses (including reasonable attorneys' fees) suffered by the Indemnified Party and arising out of or relating to (a) breach by Indemnifying Party of any of its representations, obligations or warranties in this Agreement or (b) any claims of physical injury or property damage occurring on Indemnifying Party's premises. The Indemnified Party shall promptly notify the Indemnifying Party of any such claim and shall not settle any such claim without the prior written consent of the Indemnifying Party. The Indemnifying Party shall have the right to control the defense of any such claim, with counsel reasonably acceptable to Indemnified Party.

11. OBLIGATION OF GOOD FAITH AND COOPERATION

- A) Each Party hereby agrees to deal with one another in good faith in furtherance of this agreement.
- B) Service Provider agrees to reasonably cooperate in the defense of IDEMIA against any threatened or pending litigation or in any investigation or proceeding that relates to any events or actions which occurred during or prior to the term of the Agreement. Furthermore, Service Provider agrees to reasonably cooperate in the prosecution of any claims and lawsuits brought by IDEMIA or any of its affiliates that are currently outstanding or that may in the future be brought relating to matters which occurred during or prior to the term of the Agreement.

12. LIMITATION OF LIABILITY

EXCEPT FOR BREACH OF EITHER PARTY'S OBLIGATIONS IN SECTION 6 OF THIS AGREEMENT (CONFIDENTIALITY) AND SCHEDULE B TO THIS AGREEMENT (SECURITY REQUIREMENTS), IN NO EVENT SHALL EITHER PARTY'S AGGREGATE LIABILITY FOR ANY CLAIM OR CAUSE OF ACTION ARISING OUT OF, OR RELATED TO THIS AGREEMENT, EXCEED THE TOTAL SUM OF ALL FEES PAID TO SERVICE PROVIDER BY IDEMIA DURING THE TWELVE (12) MONTHS IMMEDIATELY PRECEDING THE DATE ON WHICH THE CAUSE(S) OF ACTION AROSE. EXCEPT FOR BREACH OF EITHER PARTY'S OBLIGATIONS IN SECTION 6 OF THIS AGREEMENT (CONFIDENTIALITY) AND SCHEDULE B TO THIS AGREEMENT (SECURITY REQUIREMENTS), IN NO EVENT SHALL EITHER PARTY BE LIABLE FOR ANY INDIRECT, INCIDENTAL, CONSEQUENTIAL, PUNITIVE OR SPECIAL DAMAGES.

13. TERM AND TERMINATION

- A) This Agreement will commence on the Effective Date and remain in full force and effect until terminated by either party under the terms of this Agreement.
- B) IDEMIA may terminate this Agreement at any time upon written notice for any breach or non-compliance with this Agreement that IDEMIA reasonably believes denigrates its business reputation or could lead to termination of the Prime Contract.
- C) This Agreement shall terminate automatically and with immediate effect upon the expiration or termination of the Prime Contract or if the Agency or any party to the Prime Contract informs IDEMIA that Service Provider is no longer an approved subcontractor.
- D) Either party may terminate this Agreement in the event that a material breach by the other party remains uncured for a period of thirty (30) days from the date the party in breach receives written notice of such breach, if the breaching party is capable of curing the breach.
- E) IDEMIA may terminate this Agreement, in whole or in part (i.e., terminate the provision of a) Services provided under any one Prime Contract or b) Services provided at any individual location of Service Provider), at any time for any reason with thirty (30) days prior written notice. If requested by IDEMIA, Service Provider agrees to continue providing the Services during the thirty (30) day notice period and IDEMIA will pay Service Provider in accordance with the terms of this Agreement.

- F) Service Provider may terminate this Agreement, in whole or in part (i.e., terminate the provision of a) Services provided under any one Prime Contract or b) Services provided at any individual location of Service Provider), at any time for any reason with ninety (90) days prior written notice. If requested by IDEMIA, Service Provider agrees to continue providing the Services during the ninety (90) day notice period and IDEMIA will pay Service Provider in accordance with the terms of this Agreement.
- G) In the event of termination, Service Provider agrees to assist IDEMIA with any de-installation of the Equipment, transition of resources and work product and to provide full cooperation and support for transition to an alternate service provider.
- H) It is acknowledged that Service Provider's termination of this Agreement or cessation of Services within the first six (6) months of the date on which Service Provider begins providing Services ("Early Termination") will cause IDEMIA to incur economic damages and loss of types and in amounts which are impossible to compute and ascertain with certainty as a basis for recovery by IDEMIA of actual damages, and that liquidated damages represent a fair, reasonable and appropriate estimate thereof. Accordingly, in lieu of actual damages for Early Termination (even with the notice required under this Agreement), IDEMIA may assess and recover, as against Service Provider, without IDEMIA being required to present any evidence of the amount or character of actual damages sustained by reason thereof, liquidated damages in the amount of One Thousand Dollars (\$1,000) ("Liquidated Damages"). Liquidated Damages are intended to represent estimated actual damages and are not intended as a penalty, and Service Provider shall pay Liquidated Damages to IDEMIA without limiting IDEMIA's right to terminate this Agreement for default as provided elsewhere herein. IDEMIA may withhold any amounts due to Service Provider under this Agreement in order to recover Liquidated Damages from Service Provider.
- I) It is acknowledged that either party's termination of this Agreement or cessation of Services without proper notice will cause the non-terminating party to incur economic damages and loss of types and in amounts which are impossible to compute and ascertain with certainty as a basis for recovery by the non-terminating party of actual damages, and that liquidated damages represent a fair, reasonable and appropriate estimate thereof. Accordingly, in lieu of actual damages for termination without the notice periods prescribed by the terms of this Section 13I ("Notice Period"), the non-terminating party may assess and recover, as against the terminating party, without the non-terminating party being required to present any evidence of the amount or character of actual damages sustained by reason thereof, liquidated damages as follows ("Inadequate Notice Liquidated Damages"). In the event that Service Provider is the terminating party and provides less notice than the Notice Period, IDEMIA may withhold a) the amount due to Service Provider for the provision of Services during the month previous to that in which IDEMIA receives Service Provider's termination notice and b) an amount equal to what Service Provider would have earned through the end of the Notice Period, based on the average daily amount Service Provider earned during the term of the Agreement (i.e., total amount earned divided by number of days on which Service Provider has performed Services) ("Prorated Earnings") times the number of days remaining until the end of the Notice Period). If IDEMIA is the terminating party and provides less notice than the Notice Period, IDEMIA will pay Service Provider a) the amount due to Service Provider for the provision of Services during the month previous to that in which Service Provider receives IDEMIA's termination notice and b) 50% of Prorated Earnings times the number of days remaining until the end of the Notice Period). Inadequate Notice Liquidated Damages are intended to represent estimated actual damages and are not intended as a penalty, and the terminating party shall pay Inadequate Notice Liquidated Damages to the non-terminating party without limiting the non-

terminating party's right to terminate this Agreement for default as provided elsewhere herein. In the event that Service Provider is the party terminating the Agreement without the notice period prescribed by this Section 13, IDEMIA may withhold any amounts due to Service Provider under this Agreement in order to recover Inadequate Notice Liquidated Damages from Service Provider.

14. DOCUMENT RETENTION; AUDIT

Service Provider shall maintain records, books, files and other data and in such detail as shall properly substantiate claims for payment, for a minimum retention period of seven (7) years, beginning on the date the Services were provided, or such longer period as is necessary for the resolution of any litigation, claim, negotiation, audit or other inquiry. Service Provider shall provide IDEMIA and the Agency with access to such records during Service Provider's regular business hours and upon reasonable prior notice, including on-site reviews and reproduction of such records at IDEMIA's expense.

15. NON-DISCRIMINATION; UNFAIR LABOR PRACTICES

Service Provider shall comply with all federal, state and local laws, rules and regulations promoting fair employment practices or prohibiting employment discrimination and unfair labor practices, and shall not discriminate against any employee or applicant for employment, nor shall any qualified employee be demoted, discharged or otherwise subject to discrimination in the tenure, position, promotional opportunities, wages, benefits or terms and conditions of their employment, because of race, creed, color, national origin, ancestry, age, sex, religion, height, weight, marital status, physical or mental disability, genetic predisposition, carrier status or sexual orientation, or for exercising any rights afforded by law.

16. CONFLICT OF INTEREST

The Service Provider must not have or acquire any contractual, financial, business, or other interest, direct or indirect, that would conflict in any manner or degree with IDEMIA's performance of its duties and responsibilities under the Prime Contract or otherwise create an appearance of impropriety with respect to the award or performance of the Prime Contract. The Service Provider agrees to notify IDEMIA about the nature of any such conflict or appearance of impropriety immediately upon discovery.

17. EXPORT CONTROL

Notwithstanding anything to the contrary in this Agreement, Service Provider acknowledges and agrees that it may be subject to regulations of the U.S. Department of Commerce that prohibit the export or diversion of certain products and technologies to certain countries. Service Provider agrees that it will not export or divert any information or technology provided hereunder without fully complying with all relevant laws of and regulations, including without limitation, the US Export Administration Act of 1979, as amended, any successor legislation, and the Export Administration Regulations issued by the US Department of Commerce.

18. E-VERIFY

Service Provider warrants that it utilizes and shall continue to utilize for the term of this Agreement, the U.S. Department of Homeland Security's E-Verify system to determine the eligibility of its employees and independent contractors to lawfully work in the U.S. Service Provider shall provide, upon request of IDEMIA, proof of compliance with the terms of this Section 18 which may include an electronic or hardcopy screenshot of the confirmation or tentative non-conformation screen containing the E-Verify case verification number for any Service Provider employee or contractor performing services under this Agreement.

19. GOVERNING LAW

This Agreement shall be governed by and construed in accordance with the laws of the Commonwealth of Virginia, without regard to conflicts of law rules.

20. SURVIVAL

The sections of this Agreement which by their nature require survival after termination or completion of the Services shall survive and remain notwithstanding any termination or completion of the Services. The Sections which shall survive include, but are not limited to, Sections 3 (Remittance of Applicant Fees; Taxes), 4 (Payment to Service Provider), 5 (Equipment), 6 (Confidentiality), 7 (Non-Solicitation;), 10 (Indemnification), 11 (Obligation of Good Faith and Cooperation), 12 (Limitation of Liability), 13 (Termination), 14 (Document Retention), 16 (Conflict of Interest), 17 (Export Control), 19 (Governing Law), 20 (Survival), 23 (Severability), 24 (Notices) and 26 (Entire Agreement).

21. INDEPENDENT CONTRACTOR

The relationship between the Parties subject to this Agreement shall be independent contractors. Service Provider employees or agents rendering services under this Agreement shall not be employees of IDEMIA, the Agency or any government entity that is a party to the Prime Contract for federal or state tax purposes, or for any other purpose. Service Provider shall be responsible for workers' compensation, social security, unemployment insurance and all applicable taxes.

22. ASSIGNMENT

Neither party may assign any of its rights or delegate any of its duties, in whole or in part, without the prior written consent of the other party. Any attempted assignment or delegation without such consent shall be null and void. Notwithstanding the foregoing, IDEMIA may assign this Agreement to any current or future parent or subsidiary of IDEMIA or of such parent without Service Provider's prior written consent.

23. SEVERABILITY

If any provision of this Agreement should be held to be invalid in any way or unenforceable, it shall be severed and the remaining provisions shall not in any way be affected or impaired. This Agreement shall be construed so as to most nearly give effect to the intent of the parties as originally executed.

24. NOTICES

Any notice required by this Agreement or given in connection with it, shall be in writing and shall be given to the appropriate party by personal delivery or by certified mail, postage prepaid, or recognized overnight delivery services to the parties' respective addresses first set forth above. Except as otherwise provided herein, such notices shall be deemed given when received copies of all notices to IDEMIA shall be sent to:

25. NOTICE OF SERVICE

Immediately following receipt by Service Provider of any claim or notice of the commencement of any action, administrative, or legal proceeding, or investigation, or subpoena, or lawsuit, or any other legal action involving IDEMIA Identity & Security LLC, the Service Provider shall provide Notice thereof to IDEMIA.

26. ENTIRE AGREEMENT

This Agreement and all Attachments and Schedules contain the entire understanding between the parties concerning the subject matter hereof and supersedes all prior and contemporaneous communications and agreements with respect to such subject matter. There are no representations, warranties, terms, conditions, undertakings or collateral agreements, express, implied or statutory, between the parties other than as expressly set forth in this Agreement. No provision of this Agreement can be waived or cancelled, and this Agreement cannot be changed, modified or amended, except by an instrument in writing executed by both parties. Notwithstanding the foregoing, the parties agree that IDEMIA may amend this Agreement by providing advance written notice thereof to Service Provider, stating that if Service Provider does not respond to such notice within the time period specified, Service Provider's written acknowledgement or signature.

27. COUNTERPARTS

This Agreement may be executed in counterparts, each of which shall be deemed an original Agreement for all purposes and which collectively shall constitute one and the same Agreement. The signature of either of the parties hereto may be evidenced by a facsimile or electronic (e.g., pdf) copy of this Agreement bearing such signature and transmitted to the other party. Such signature shall be valid and binding as if an original executed copy of the Agreement has been delivered.

STATEMENT OF WORK FOR KIOSK ("SOW")

A. <u>Services</u>. In consideration of IDEMIA's payment to Service Provider of the Fees, Service Provider hereby agrees to provide Services in accordance with the terms and conditions of this Agreement and of all Attachments and Schedules hereto and any SOW, which shall be deemed incorporated into, and made a part of, this Agreement by this reference. Service Provider hereby agrees that IDEMIA may identify Service Provider as a subcontractor and provide relevant contact information in any proposals or bids IDEMIA submits for Prime Contracts or renewals thereof.

B. Summary:

1) IDEMIA is a Prime Contract holder with various Agencies to provide electronic fingerprint services to Applicants who require a fingerprint-based background check by one or more State and agencies. Applicants are required to have a fingerprint-based background check pursuant to State or Federal law. IDEMIA transmits Applicant fingerprints and biographic information to the respective Agency, and the Agency runs the fingerprints through its state Automated Fingerprint Identification System (AFIS) and the Federal Bureau of Investigation (FBI) database to perform a criminal history check. After the Agency has adjudicated the results, the results are then made available by the Agency to the requesting agency, volunteer organization, employer, etc. This SOW describes the basic requirements for the Service Provider to provide fingerprinting services to IDEMIA in support of the Prime Contract.

The Agencies for this SOW are those listed below:

C. Fee Structure:

- 1) The following fee categories are applicable to this SOW:
 - i. Enrollment Fee \$1.00 This fee is earned upon completion of all enrollment steps required and successful submission of an Applicant fingerprint record.
- 2) IDEMIA may, from time to time, add additional Agencies and/or user groups under this SOW without formal amendment to the Agreement. When new Agencies and/or user groups are added program, IDEMIA will provide written notification (email is acceptable) and will be paid under the Fee Structure outlined in C.1.i.. Service Provider will provide written notice (email is acceptable) to agree or to decline the additional Agency and/or user groups.
- 3) Service Provider shall not collect any additional Fees for any Applicant.

D. Service Provider Responsibilities:

- The Service Provider shall provide ADA compliant facilities and space within those facilities
 dedicated for Equipment. Service Provider locations must be pre-approved to work on this SOW
 through an internal IDEMIA vetting process and then through the Agency (if required by the
 Agency).
- 2) Service Provider is prohibited from requesting, collecting, viewing, or maintaining any Applicant PII other than expressly permitted within this SOW.
- 3) Service Provider will not interfere with IDEMIA's operations, included but not limited to the following: 1) Service Provider is prohibited from moving the Equipment, 2) Service Provider will not tamper with or cause damage to the Equipment, including internet routers and all peripherals,

- 3) Service Provider will not prevent Applicants from accessing Equipment to complete enrollments.
- 4) Service Provider shall provide qualified personnel to serve as Point of Contact(s) ("POC"). POCs staffed for this program shall support Services at their respective location as follows, POC will:
 - i. Be available during Kiosk HOO.
 - ii. Greet Applicants when they arrive.
 - iii. Dress professionally.
 - iv. Interface with IDEMIA's Partner Support Group (PSG) for day-to-day items and escalations (i.e. changes to hours of operation, etc.) and IDEMIA's Technical Help Desk ("THD") to report technical difficulties.
 - v. Keep Equipment stocked with receipt printer paper supplied by IDEMIA.
 - vi. Will comply with the training provided by IDEMIA for cleaning of Equipment and will only use approved cleaning supplies (i.e. alcohol-based cleaning solutions may not be used on Equipment).
 - vii. Promptly open a ticket with THD and support troubleshooting directed by the THD should Service Provider become aware of an Equipment issue
 - viii. Have a key for opening the Equipment to perform a system restart. The key to the Equipment will be kept in a secure location when not in use and may not accessed by anyone that is not a designated POC. The POC will assist with THD troubleshooting of the Equipment.
 - ix. Immediately notify IDEMIA's Partner Support Group as soon as they become aware of any known or suspected compromises of Personally Identifiable Information (PII) (Any information that can be used to distinguish or trace an individual's identity, such as name, social security number, date and place of birth, mother's maiden name, or biometric records) to persons not authorized to receive that information. Compromises of sensitive PII include but are not limited to the following examples:
 - 1. A Service Provider employee having access to Sensitive PII intentionally
 - 2. If Service Provider employee discovers a customer's government issued ID that was lost or left at the location, the POC will immediately notify IDEMIA so that the customer may be contacted. Service Provider will ensure that the associated PII is kept private and not shared with other persons or entities
 - 3. If Service Provider observes a 3rd party taking photographs or video of an Applicant's information.
- 5) Service Provider warrants that it utilizes and shall continue to utilize for the term of this Agreement, the U.S. Department of Homeland Security's E-Verify system to determine the eligibility of its employees and independent contractors supporting this SOW to lawfully work in the U.S.
- 6) Only Service Provider employees that have completed all IDEMIA training requirements may perform Services outlined in this SOW.
- 7) IDEMIA will provide initial training for Service Provider employees at IDEMIA expense. Service Provider employees must commit to focused training which includes approximately twenty (20) minutes of training. Examples of specific training topics include, but are not limited to:
 - i. Greeting Procedures
 - ii. Equipment Care and Supplies
- 8) Service Provider will be responsible for a reasonable quality of the work related to POC activities outlined in D.4. IDEMIA reserves the contractual right to request the immediate removal of any Service Provider POC. In the case of such removal, Service Provider will immediately provide a replacement POC at the respective store.

- 9) The Service Provider is responsible for maintaining an adequate number of POCs and personnel to ensure day-to-day continuity of operations.
- 10) Service Provider will provide reliable electrical power within ten (10) feet of the Equipment, and all organizational and program-related resources that could reasonably be foreseeable to deliver the Services.
- 11) Service Provider agrees that any Equipment provided by IDEMIA shall remain the sole property of IDEMIA and shall be used exclusively for the provision of Services. Service Provider employees are prohibited from interacting with the Equipment in any way that is not expressly outlined within this SOW.
- 12) Enrollment Center Quality Control: Service Provider will strive to meet the standards outlined in this SOW. Service Provider will allow IDEMIA employee(s), contractors, or customers to occasionally visit each location to confirm standards are still being met. Standards being reviewed during these visits will include, but are not limited to:
 - i. ADA compliance (facility and parking)
 - ii. Compliance with Signage and Branding Minimum Requirements
 - iii. Equipment placement and condition
 - iv. Consumable and their storage
 - v. POC availability and knowledge of the Kiosk program
- 13) Service Provider shall comply with any signage and branding guidelines provided by IDEMIA, including those in Schedule F. For the avoidance of doubt, Service Provider shall avoid all use of IDEMIA logos or that of its customers (e.g, the Agency) without IDEMIA's permission.
- 14) Service Provider shall not alter IDEMIA signage or any other IDEMIA-branded items (collectively "Signage"), or display any Signage not provided or previously authorized by IDEMIA. Signage is subject to change and IDEMIA may, from time to time, ask the Service Provider to update Signage and/or provide access to Service Provider's facility so that IDEMIA may make any such updates. Service Provider shall not display any hand-made signage, and Service Provider hereby acknowledges that any such display is a violation of U.S. federal, state and international copyright and trademark law.
- 15) Service Provider will have published hours of operation ("HOO"), which shall be: Monday Friday 8:30AM 12:00PM & 1:00PM 4:30PM.
- 16) Service Provider may adjust the HOO that each Service Provider location is open to the public at any Service Provider location. Any such HOO changes requested by Service Provider must be requested in writing (email is acceptable) with a minimum of thirty (30) days' notice, and notice must be pre-approved in writing by IDEMIA.
- 17) The Service Provider shall provide Services for 100% of the published HOO. In the event the specified, standard days and hours of operation cannot be met and a single event closure, whether scheduled or unscheduled, of the site is necessary, Service Provider will offer replacement hours comparable to the lost hours respective to the closure date(s) requested, in order to accommodate Applicant scheduling needs.
- 18) Service Provider will ensure Enrollment Center availability 52 weeks per year, with no seasonally oriented closures or reduced operational periods.
- 19) Service Provider shall obtain and maintain insurance as specified herein at all times during the term of the Agreement. All insurance policies required by this SOW shall be issued by insurance companies that may be subject to approval by IDEMIA's Prime Contract customers

i. Fire Damage

Commercial general liability insurance covering \$50,000 of fire damage for any 1 fire.

ii. Protected Information

Liability insurance covering all loss of Confidential Information, such as personally identifiable information, payment card information, and criminal justice information, and claims based on alleged violations of privacy rights through improper use or disclosure of protected information with minimum limits as follows:

- 1. \$1,000,000 each occurrence; and
- 2. \$2,000,000 general aggregate.

iii. Professional Liability Insurance

Professional liability insurance covering any damages caused by an error, omission or any negligent act with minimum limits as follows:

- 1. \$1,000,000 each occurrence; and
- 2. \$1,000,000 general aggregate.

iv. Crime Insurance

Crime insurance including employee dishonesty coverage with minimum limits as follows:

- 1. \$1,000,000 each occurrence; and
- 2. \$1,000,000 general aggregate.

v. Additional Insured

IDEMIA's Prime Contract customers shall be named as an additional insured on all commercial general liability.

- 20) Service Provider shall comply with relevant Prime Contract documentation requirements provided by IDEMIA for the jurisdictions in which Service Provider provides Services. Examples of such documentation requirements include, but is not limited to:
 - i. Attestations
 - ii. Certifications
 - iii. Certificates of insurance
 - iv. Affidavits
 - v. Nondisclosure & confidentiality agreements
 - vi. Nondiscrimination & sexual harassment agreements
- 21) Service Provider shall not discriminate in violation of applicable state and federal laws against any citizen who is qualified and available to perform the work to which the employment relates. Service Provider nor any subcontractor nor any person on their behalf shall in any manner discriminate in violation of the applicable state federal laws against or intimidate any employee involved in the manufacture of supplies, the performance of work, or any other activity required under the contract.
- 22) Service Provider shall establish and maintain a written nondiscrimination and sexual harassment policy and shall inform their employees of the policy. The policy must contain a provision that sexual harassment will not be tolerated and employees who practice it will be disciplined. Posting this Nondiscrimination/Sexual Harassment Clause conspicuously in easily-accessible and well-lighted places customarily frequented by employees and at or near where the contract services are performed shall satisfy this requirement.
- 23) Service Provider shall not discriminate in violation of applicable state and federal laws against any subcontractor or supplier who is qualified to perform the work to which the contract relates.
- 24) Service Provider represents that it is presently in compliance with and will maintain compliance with applicable federal, state, and local laws and regulations relating to nondiscrimination and sexual harassment. The Contractor and each subcontractor further represents that it has filed a Standard Form 100 Employer Information Report ("EEO-1") with the U.S. Equal Employment Opportunity

In addition, the frame offers a Customer Service Feedback number. Retail services vary by location, if the EC does not offer one of the advertised services, refer the customer to IdentoGO.com.

Form of Payment (8.5" W x 11" H)

The Payable to IDEMIA sign is on the digital frame, which is placed at the receptionist desk, sign-in counter or greeter's desk, within view of the Greeter or Enrollment Agent (EA).

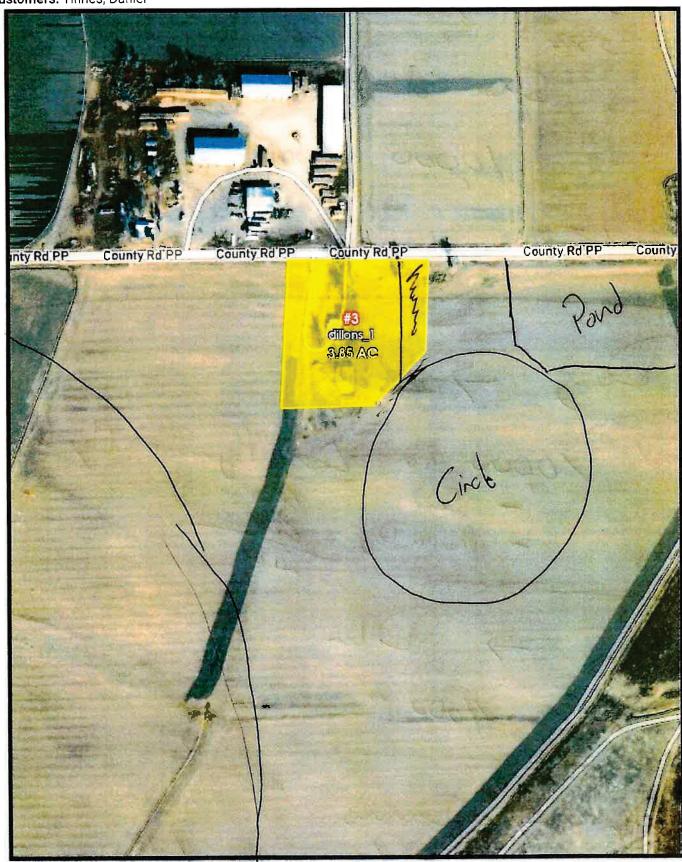
