Item #6 – Discuss & Take Action on Tax Collector Suspense List

These accounts will be posted to suspense and will be removed from consideration as assets of the Town, but are not abated as a tax liability against whom it was levied. Personal Property and Motor Vehicle suspense taxes can and will be collected, whenever possible.

These are properties that Dana Flach has not been able (after extensive effort) to collect delinquent taxes on. The total this year is \$122,758.96. We can still collect on these should we receive a payment. Andy North asked about Mags Pizza and Ted's Lawn Care. Dana said she has talked to them tracked to Florida. A good majority of this number is for the Kinneytown Dam and Connecticut Brownfield Land Bank (State is taking Ownership). The Kinneytown Dam was taken over by the Connecticut Brownfield which was funded by the DEEP/EPA because it is a dirty site. They want to take down the Dam. This is not what the Town wants to own – it is millions of dollars. They will turn over to Town which will be untaxable.

Annmarie Drugonis said these properties are leined and we will wait until we can get these properties in foreclosure and then try to sell.
